ELIGIBILITY OF CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes prize wins are those gained at any Kennel Club Open licensed event (i.e. invitation events and special classes excepted). This classification applies to competitions for both standard, midi and mini dogs.

Standard Classes

ELEMENTARY For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a third prize or above in an Agility and/or a Jumping Class at a licensed Agility Test.

STARTERS For owners, handlers or dogs which have not won an Agility and/or a Jumping Class at a licensed Agility Test (Elementary excepted).

INTERMEDIATE Open to all except dogs eligible for Elementary and Starters Classes at a licensed Agility Test.

SENIORS Open to dogs having won at least two first prizes, one of which must be an Agility Class, at a licensed Agility Test (Elementary and Starter wins excepted).

Competitions for Small Dogs (Minis)

Those dogs eligible to compete in competitions for small dogs are those measuring 1ft 3ins (38.1cm) or under at the withers.

Competitions for Small Dogs (Midis)

Those dogs eligible to compete in competitions for Midi dogs are those measuring over 1ft 3ins (381mm) and under 1ft 5 ins (432mm) at the withers. Trophies to 1st place.

Special Classes

Junior:

CLASSES 4, 18 and 21 Handlers must be under 12 years **OR** 12 years and over but under 18 years on the first day of the Show, 17th August 2004. Dogs may **not** be entered in both UNDER 12 and OVER 12 classifications. Trophies to 1st and 2nd places in both parts.

CLASS 32; Handlers must be under 25 years and over 6 years on 17th August 2004, the first day of the Show. Crufts qualifiers **MUST** be members of the Young Kennel Club.

Mini / Midi Pairs

Class is open to mini and midi dogs and will be run as one class; a pair consists of 2 dogs and 2 handlers. Class may be Jumping/Agility, Agility/Agility or Jumping/Jumping as circumstances allow and at judge's discretion. Jump height max. 381mm).

Starter Pairs

Class open to standard Starter dogs only; a pair consists of 2 dogs and 2 handlers. Class may be Jumping/Agility, Agility/Agility or Jumping/Jumping as circumstances allow and at judge's discretion.

Intermediate Pairs

Class open to standard Intermediate dogs only; a pair consists of 2 dogs and 2 handlers. Class may be Jumping/Agility, Agility/Agility or Jumping/Jumping as circumstances allow and at judge's discretion.

Any Size Jumping

These classes are open to dogs of all sizes, **not entered** in any other classes at this show, **PART (a)** for dogs measuring over 1ft 3ins (381mm) at the withers (Jump height max. 381mm); **PART (b)** for dogs measuring under 1ft 3ins (381mm) at the withers (Jump height max. 260mm); [no long jump or tyre in either part]; trophies to 1st place.

Welsh National Agility Handler 2004, Classes 1 and 9

Classes are open only to standard and mini dogs; owner or joint owner **and** handler must reside in Wales. Dogs must be run in both classes for faults and time from both classes to be added together; least overall faults and fastest aggregate time wins. [Elimination 100 faults]. *With special thanks to the Western Mail.*

Intermediate/Starters/Mini Midi Helter Skelter, Classes 30, 35 and 44

Special jumping classes open to standard intermediate / standard starter / mini midi dogs as defined in the class list. Mini midi dogs run as one class.

Class 32: YKC Agility "Agility Dog of the Year" Qualifying Heat. Trophies 1st 2nd and 3rd overall. This Special Class will be divided into 4 age group parts Ages as at 17th August 2004;

Dogs may only be entered in 1 age group part:

- a) Handlers 6 - 11 years
- b) Handlers 12 - 15 years
- c) Handlers 16 - 18 years
- d) Handlers 19 - 25 years

Handlers must be under 25 on 17th August 2004. Within each part there will be sections for standard, midi and mini dogs. The highest placed YKC member in each of these 12 sections will be invited to Crufts 2005 to compete in the semi-final for the YKC Agility Dog of the Year 2005

Tournaments

The Perpetual **Rompie Wood Memorial Trophy** will be won by the junior handler who attains the highest number of points from places in the following **classes 4, 18 and 21**, (1st place 6 points, 2nd place 5 points etc.). *(With special thanks to Mrs. Heather Wood).*

The Perpetual **"Golden Valley DTC" Welsh Challenge Trophy** will be won by the Welsh Club which aggregates the highest number of points from places in all classes at this Show. Points awarded as follows; classes with places, 1 – 20, 1st place 20 points, 2nd place 19 points etc; classes with places 1 – 6, 1st - 6 points, 2nd - 5 points etc.. The Club **MUST** be declared on the entry form and may not be altered after the closing date. The tournament is open to all clubs and training groups with main TRAINING VENUE in Wales. *(By kind permission of Golden Valley Dog Training Club.)*

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/ATC number will be required for each entry. From the 1st January 2001 the registration number is required on each entry.
2. Entry fees all classes: £2.00p per dog / class (Classes 6, 15 and 34: £4.00 per pair)
3. Amount of prize money: Overall result of aggregate of Special Classes 1 and 9 – "Special Welsh National Agility Handler 2004", 1st Place: £50, 2nd Place: £25, and Best Junior £25.
4. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests.
6. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.

7. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
10. Dogs must not wear slip chains, collars or leads when under test.
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of a judge or judges.
13. Sponsorship of classes is as follows;
Classes 1 and 9 The Western Mail, Class 32 Young Kennel Club.
All other classes: Pembrokeshire Agricultural Society
14. Dogs will be received at any time.
15. Kennel Club Standard marking Regulations apply.
16. The heights of the jump obstacles will be as defined in Kennel Club Regulations H.(standard dogs – 762 mm max., midi dogs – 508 mm max., mini dogs – 381 mm max.), except for classes 7, 20 and 33 see definitions of classes above.
17. Competition for Small Dogs (Minis) Those dogs eligible to compete in competitions for small dogs are those measuring 1ft 3ins (38.1cms) or under at the withers.
18. Competition for Small Dogs (Midis) Those dogs eligible to compete in competitions for Midi dogs are those measuring over 1ft 3 ins (38.1cms) and those measuring 1ft 5 ins (43.2cms) or under at the withers.
19. Judges at an Agility Test may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Test at which they are judging.
20. Withdrawal of dogs from Test
A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Test if it is:-
A bitch which is in season.
Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
21. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 7 days before the date of closing of entries (i.e. Friday 2 July 2004) shall be counted when entering for any class.
22. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
23. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
24. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. The Committee reserves the right to appoint further judges as necessary.
25. A dog must at the time of entry for the Competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitors' name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owners' property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
26. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
27. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
28. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease –No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the

Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.

29. Animals in Event - No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.
30. Competitors must wear ring numbers when competing.
31. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that the correct score is recorded on the scoresheet. Mistakes cannot be rectified after the class has closed.
32. No practice or training is permitted in a ring, except in the ring provided.
33. Parents/guardians are responsible for the behaviour and safety of their children under 18.
34. In the event of cancellation and or abandonment the Committee reserves the right to defray from entries and income received, such costs as they deem are necessary.
35. Dogs are entered at the owners' risk and whilst every care will be taken, the Club, Committee and officials will accept no responsibility for loss, damage, or injury howsoever caused to dogs persons or property while at the Show.
36. Rosettes should be claimed at the Show.
37. Any dog which is of such a temperament or is so much out of hand or a real or potential danger to other dogs or people at the Show will be required to leave within one hour of the decision of the Competition management.
38. Please use the signed exercise area(s) having regard to other dogs and their owners, as well as members of the public.
39. Entries should be made on the official entry form or photocopies thereof.
