RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry Fees £2 per dog per class (£1.00 for club members)
3. No. Prize money
4. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests.
6. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden
7. No bitch in season is allowed to compete
8. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
9. Dogs must not wear slip chains, collars or leads when under test.
10. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge?
11. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
12. Sponsors CSJ Petfoods , Pedigree Petfoods, Petnat Products and Adams Agility
13. Dogs will not be accepted in a class after the final call has been given.
14. Standard Marking will apply as published in KC Year Book 2004/2005,
15. Jump heights will 2ft 6inches in all classes.
16. A judge at any Agility Test cannot compete or enter a dog at that event.
17. Withdrawal of dogs from Test
18. A dog will be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Test if it is: -
 - a. A bitch which is in season
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing
19. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 7 days before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 3rd June 2004
20. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
21. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
22. A dog must at the time of entry for the Competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitors' name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owners' property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
23. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except a registered guide dog for the blind or hearing dog for the deaf, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.
24. In the event that the show has to be cancelled, Scunthorpe Obedience & Agility Training Club reserve the right to defray from entries received such costs, as they deem necessary.
25. Entry form must contain owners' signature & K.C. Registration Number.
26. No Refunds will be given in the event of incorrect monies submitted; it is the competitors' responsibility to check the entry before submission.
27. All dogs are entered at their owners' risk, whilst every care will be taken, Scunthorpe Obedience & Agility Training Club will not accept responsibility for the loss, damage or injury to persons, dogs or property.

PEDIGREE ABC AGILITY - RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Pedigree Masterfoods ABC Agility is a special agility competition to be run under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations H for standard dogs.
2. The competition is open to all dogs excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and their crosses. (Any Breeds but Collies). In the event of dispute, the judge's decision will be final
3. The first **four** dogs of each heat will qualify for the Final. The next **four** placed dogs at a Heat will be deemed to be reserves should a qualified dog be unable to attend the Final. Reserves from Heats will be invited to attend the final up to and including the closing date of the NHDTC Show. After the closing date **NO** reserves will be called even if other qualifiers have to retire.
4. Dogs that have already qualified for the Final may enter further heats 'not for competition'.
5. A handler may qualify more than one dog for the Final.
6. Those dogs eligible to compete in the Final shall be the winners of each heat of the best placed dogs not previously qualified.
7. The Final will be held at the annual Newton Heath DTC show held at Tatton Park, Cheshire, in June of each year. Any alteration will be publicised.
8. Owners, handlers and dogs who enter the Heats/Final will be deemed to have accepted the Rules and Regulations of the competition and the organising show.
9. The organisers, Newton Heath DTC and Pedigree Masterfoods in agreement, reserve the right to alter these rules and Regulations at their discretion.

ELIGABILITY AND DEFINITION OF CLASSES

ELEMENTARY:- Open to owners, handlers or dogs who have not gained a third prize or above in an Agility and/or Agility test .

STARTERS:- For owners, handlers or dogs which have not won an Agility and/or a Jumping Class at a licensed Agility Test (Elementary excepted).

NOVICE:- Open to dogs which are not eligible for Senior or Advanced Classes

INTERMEDIATE:- Open to all except dogs eligible for Elementary and Starters class at a licensed Agility Test

SENIOR:- Open to dogs who having won at least 2 first prizes, one of which must be an Agility Class, at a licensed Agility Test (Elementary and Starter wins excepted)

OPEN:- Open to all

ABC:- Open to all dogs except Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and their crosses. Etc etc etc

The Adams Derby Novice Special - Rules of Competition

1. This class will be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition.
2. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
3. The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at Novice Level.
4. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
5. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may not enter any further heats except as a not for competition entry. Handlers running not for competition with a previously qualified dog must report to the Show Secretary before running in the class.
6. The first four dogs from each heat will be invited to compete in the final.
7. The next four dogs from each heat will be held as reserves.
8. In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up in numerical order.
9. In the event of a handler being unable to compete in a heat due to illness or injury a substitute handler for the qualifying dog will be allowed to run the dog.
10. The first section of the competition will contain the following pieces of equipment: A Frame, Dog Walk, See Saw, a rising spread jump set at a minimum of two feet and a long jump set at a minimum of four foot six inches. The placement of these obstacles is at the Judge's discretion.
11. The first section is un-timed and dogs must successfully complete this section without faults before proceeding to the second section of the competition. Dogs with faults will not be allowed to proceed to the second section.
12. The second section is timed and will contain no more than fourteen but no less than twelve single pole hurdles set at two foot six inches plus a set of twelve weaves. The placement of these obstacles is at the Judge's discretion.
13. Handlers are not allowed to touch their dogs between the separate elements of the first section but may touch their dogs between the first and second sections of the competition.
14. The object of the competition is to complete the control section of the class successfully before competing, against the clock, on a jumping course. The winner and subsequent places will be decided on the fastest time with least faults over the second section of the course.

CSJ Novice Agility Competition Sponsored by CSJ Specialist Canine

Seven heats to be held at various Agility shows around the country throughout the year with the final being held at a major County Show (Date and venue to be confirmed)

The first four handlers and dogs in each heat to go forward to the Final.

A heat would need to be split into two parts subject to the number of dogs entered exceeded KC maximums. This would mean a duplicate of prizes with the first two handlers and dogs in each part going forward.

1st Prize + rosette and / or card Plus Product Prize / Voucher

2nd Prize + rosette and / or card Plus Product Prize / Voucher

3rd Prize + rosette and / or card plus product prize / voucher

4th rosette and / or card plus product prize / voucher

1 - 20th rosettes

CSJ Novice Agility Qualifier - Rules & Regulations

Eligibility for the competition will be as per the Kennel Club

classification for Novice in force at the time. The competition must be judged under the appropriate

Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the event. Competitors entering the competition must be deemed to have agreed to abide by those Rules and Regulations.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat, but may only qualify one dog for the final. Each heat is open to all competitors eligible for Novice.

Qualifiers may enter further heats for competition, providing they are eligible. Handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the Show Secretary on the date of the show of this fact. The competition will consist of 7 heats with the first 4 from each heat going through to the final, 5th and 6th place being reserves for that heat. In the event of someone qualifying more than once for the final, reserves will be taken from the appropriate heat. Surrogate Handlers will not be allowed.

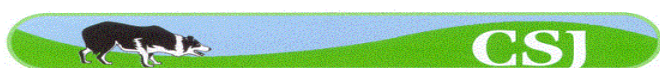
PEDIGREE CRUFTS FLYBALL QUALIFIER

This is a team competition (knock-out). Two teams will compete against each other on separate equipment. The best two of three runs will decide the winner to go into the next round. Each team shall consist of four handlers and dogs plus two reserves. A club may enter more than one team, and a club may qualify more than one team for the final. No handler or dog can enter more than one team. The top two teams will be invited to compete in the quarter-final/final at Crufts 2005. This competition is governed by Kennel Club guideline rules for Flyball in force at the time of the heat/final. This event will be run with Kennel Club/Crufts type boxes which will be provided at the event. Please refer to the current Kennel Club year book

DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE→

Directions from the Humber Bridge

After crossing the river take the first slip road sign-posted Barton and Winterton (A1077) and take the 3rd exit at the slip road roundabout.

Follow this road through the village of South Ferriby, past the cement works and along the side of the river. As the road leaves the side of the river you will approach some very sharp bends in the road. On one of these bends take a left turn sign-posted Appleby and Broughton.

Take the 2nd turning on your right sign-posted Winterton. The venue is $\frac{1}{4}$ mile on your right hand side. If you reach the mini roundabout you have gone too far.

From the A15 (Lincoln, Newark, and A1 South etc)

At the junction with the M180 take the 2nd exit at the roundabout signposted A18 Scunthorpe, Brigg and Broughton. Now proceed to *

From the East (Grimsby etc)

Leave the M180 at junction 4 and take the 3rd exit at the roundabout signposted A18 Scunthorpe, Brigg and Broughton. Now proceed to *

From the West (M1, M18, M62 etc)

Leave the M180 at junction 4 and take the 1st exit at the roundabout signposted A18 Scunthorpe, Brigg and Broughton. Now proceed to *

* At the next roundabout take the 2nd exit sign-posted **Broughton**. At the mini-roundabout in Broughton Village bear left sign-posted **scenic drive**. In approx. 2.5 miles you will reach a railway crossing. Care is needed here as the crossing is very uneven. Having driven through the village of Appleby continue for approximately 2 miles, taking the 3rd turning on your left sign-posted **Winterton** (do not take the first turning on your left which is also sign-posted Winterton as this involves a difficult junction for caravans!). The venue is $\frac{1}{4}$ mile on your right hand side. If you reach the mini roundabout you have gone too far.
