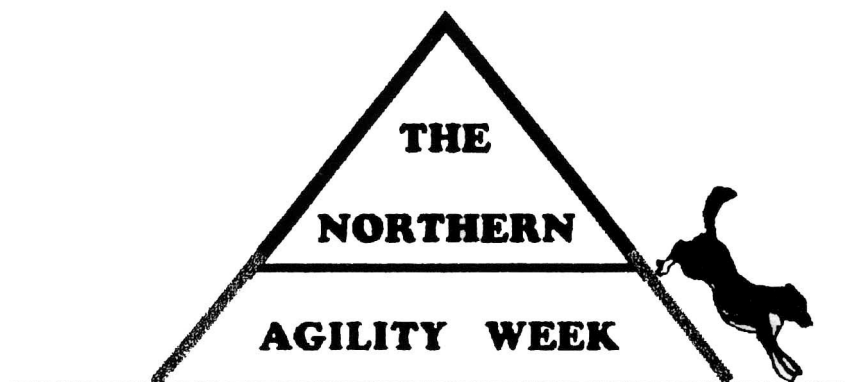

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number / Authority To Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry Fees: £1.90 per dog per class, Championship Classes £12.00, Pairs £3.80, Flyball Team £7.50. Camping Fees: £6.00 per night.
3. No prize money is on offer for any class.
4. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible to compete at Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests.
6. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form. There is no charge for this.
7. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
10. Dogs must not wear slip chains, collars or leads when under test.
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
13. Sponsors for the Show are Pedigree Masterfood.
14. Dogs will be received for competition at any time. If dogs are received after the class has been declared closed they will forfeit the entries except under exceptional and unforeseen circumstances and by special permission of the Management.
15. Kennel Club Standard marking Regulations apply as defined and published in the Kennel Club Year Book in use at the time of the Show for all Classes.
16. The height of the Jump obstacles will be 2ft 6ins except in Veteran classes which will be at 2ft, Midi Classes which will be at 1ft 8ins and Mini Classes which will be at 1ft 3ins.
17. Competition for Small Dogs (Minis): Those dogs eligible to compete in competitions for small dogs are those measuring 1ft 3ins (381mm) or under at the withers.
18. Competition for Small Dogs (Midis): Those dogs eligible to compete in competitions for Midi dogs are those measuring over 1ft 3ins (381mm) and those measuring 1ft 5ins (432mm) or under at the withers.
19. Judges at an Agility Test and / or Flyball Competition may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Test / Competition at which they are judging.
20. Withdrawal of dogs from Test.
A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Test if it is:-
 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
21. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 7 days before the date of the closing of entries (31st May 2004) shall be counted when entering for any class.
22. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
23. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
24. Not applicable.
25. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.

RULES AND REGULATIONS (CONTINUED)

26. A dog must at the time of entry for the Competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitor's name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owners' property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
27. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
28. Ballot for Championship Class Running Orders
 - a. Agility Round and Jumping Round – A draw for the running order of the Agility and Jumping Rounds must be made prior to the show. The relevant competitors must be notified before the day of the show.
 - b. Final Agility Round – The draw for the final agility round must be conducted at the Show, by the judge, in the presence of the competitors and a representative of the Show Management.
29. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or their authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
30. Not applicable.
31. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and / or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
32. Animals in Event
No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.
33. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show / event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor / competitor.
34. All dogs are entered at their owners risk & whilst every care will be taken to ensure the safety of all aspects of the Show, Wilton Agility Club & its members will not accept responsibility for the loss, damage or injury to dogs, persons or property whilst at the Show.
35. In the abandonment that the Show has to be cancelled, the Committee reserve the right to defray such expenses incurred from the entry fees received, as they deem necessary.
36. Mini & Midi Dogs must be measured before competing in their first class of the Show. Failure to do so may result in disqualification from the Class.
37. Should any question arise not provided for in these Regulations or the Kennel Club Rules, the Committee's decision shall be final, subject only to appeal to the Kennel Club.
38. Normal rules apply during test, but in addition, poop-a-scoops must be used at all times in all areas of the showground, including the marked exercise area. Failure to comply could result in elimination from the event.
39. The judges' decisions will be final & no competitor will be allowed to influence that in any way. The Show Committee will stand by the judges' decisions in all cases.
40. The times recorded by the official time-keepers in the rings will be the only recognised timings of that competition. Times recorded outside the rings by competitors or spectators will have no relevance to the timing of the competition in any way. Any competitor verbally abusing the ring parties on these matters will be asked to leave the Show and may be forfeiting the chance to enter any future Shows held by Wilton Agility Club.

ELIGIBILITY & DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes, First Prize wins are those gained at any Kennel Club Open licensed event (i.e. invitation events and special classes excepted). This classification applies to competitions for standard, midi and mini dogs.

Agility classes to include contact points and Jumping classes where there are not contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows for competitions for standard, midi and mini dogs:-

STARTERS	For owners, handlers or dogs which have not won an Agility and / or a Jumping Class at a licensed Agility Test (Elementary excepted).
NOVICE	Open to dogs which are not eligible for Senior or Advanced Classes.
INTERMEDIATE	Open to all except dogs eligible for Elementary and Starters Classes at a licensed Agility Test.
SENIORS	Open to dogs having won at least two first prizes, one of which must be an Agility Class, at a licensed Agility Test (Elementary and Starter wins excepted).
ADVANCED	Open to dogs having a minimum of four wins at a licensed Agility Test, two of which must be gained in Intermediate, Senior or Open Agility Classes (not jumping; Elementary, Starter and Novice wins excepted).
OPEN	Open to all.
CHAMPIONSHIP (Standard & Mini)	Open to all dogs having qualified to Advanced Status. To consist of 2 qualifying rounds of Standard Kennel Club Classes, 1 Agility Class and 1 Jumping Class and a final round of Agility to be held at the same Show.
MIDI	Open to dogs over 1ft 3ins (381mm) and under 1ft 5ins (432mm) at the withers.
MINI	Open to dogs 1ft 3ins (381mm) or less at withers.
SPECIAL ABC	Open to all dogs EXCEPT Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and their crosses.
SPECIAL BC	Open to Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and their crosses.
SPECIAL PAIRS	Open to all standard dogs. Dogs may only be entered in one pair.
SPECIAL MINI PAIRS	Open to all mini dogs. Dogs may only be entered in one pair.
VETERAN	Open to standard dogs that are 10 years or over on 28 th August 2004 and not entered in any other non-Veteran classes. These classes will NOT include weaves or tyres. Jump heights for Veterans will be set at 2ft.
JUNIOR	Open to handlers under the age of 18 on 28 th August 2004. U12s is 11 years old or under and O12s is 12 years old and over (but under 18). Please indicate age category on entry form. The class will be split into Standard, Midi and Mini but handlers are limited to 2 dogs in total.

Please note that competitors may only enter one type of class, i.e. Mini, Midi or Standard.

MINI & MIDI DOGS

Mini & Midi dogs must be measured before competing in their first class of the Show (see Rule 36).

SPECIAL PAIRS

Theme is **"The Wild West"**!

Fancy dress is optional, but if either partner chooses not to wear fancy dress, they will incur a 20 second penalty per pair!

SPECIAL OPEN TIMED GAMBLE

A standard Agility course with standard marking but you tell the scribe your optimum time. The winner will be the clear round nearest to the handler's own specified course time. Speed does not count: it is how close you get, clear, to your own time. The Gamble is if you run faster than your optimum time you are eliminated even if you have a clear round. There will be a set course time (generous) so no silly times or hanging around: you will be penalised!

SPECIAL TIME, FAULT & OUT

A standard Agility course with a set course time. The winner will be the person who has completed the most obstacles clear within the course time. If you should fault at any point within the course time, a whistle will sound & you should make your way as fast as possible to the finish section of the course. Whether you are allowed to take other obstacles on your way to the finish will be announced at the judges' briefings.

SPECIAL DOWN & OUT

A standard Jumping course with a set course time. The winner will be the person who has completed the most obstacles clear within the course time. If you should fault at any point within the course time, a whistle will sound & you should make your way as fast as possible to the finish section of the course. Whether you are allowed to take other obstacles on your way to the finish will be announced at the judges' briefings.

SPECIAL HELTER SKELTER

A standard Jumping course set in a spiral running from the outside in OR from the inside out with standard marking with a set course time.

PEDIGREE CRUFTS TEAM FLYBALL

This is a team competition (knockout). Two teams will compete against each other on separate equipment. The best two of three runs will decide the winner to go into the next round. Each team will consist of four handlers & dogs plus two reserves. A club may enter more than one team, and a club may qualify more than one team for the final. No handler or dog may enter more than one team. The FIRST TWO TEAMS from each heat will be invited to compete in the semi-final / final at Crufts 2005 (subject to Kennel Club approval). This competition is governed by Kennel Club guidelines for Flyball in force at the time of the heat / final. This event will be run with Kennel Club / Crufts type boxes, which will be provided at the event.

CHAMPIONSHIP STANDARD & MINI AGILITY CLASS

NOTE: THIS CLASS WILL START AT NORMAL TIME, I.E. 8.30 AM

A Kennel Club Agility Certificate will be awarded to any Standard Agility Dog or any Mini Agility Dog winning a Championship Agility Class provided such a dog has no faults in the final round of the class. If the winning dog does have faults in the final round of the Championship Agility Class the award must be withheld.

A Reserve Agility Certificate will be awarded to any Standard Agility Dog or any Mini Agility Dog placed second in the Championship Agility Class provided it has gained a clear round in the final round of the class. If the second placed dog has faults in the final round the award must be withheld.

Format of the competition:

The top 20 competitors from the combined results of the 2 qualifying rounds will contest a final round of Agility to determine the overall winner. The top 20 places will be determined by combining the accumulated placings gained by the dogs in the qualifying rounds.

The first placed dog in the final round, having achieved a clear round, will be awarded a Championship Agility Certificate.

The second placed dog in the final round, having achieved a clear round, will be awarded a Reserve Championship Agility Certificate.

A dog having being eliminated in either qualifying round will not be eligible for the final, even if placed in the top 20 placings.
