



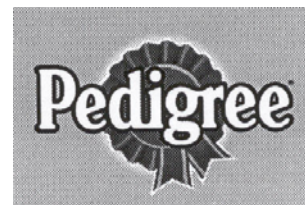

DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE

Directions from the Humber Bridge

After crossing the river take the first slip road sign-posted Barton and Winterton (A1077) and take the 3rd exit at the slip road roundabout.

Follow this road through the village of South Ferriby, past the cement works and along the side of the river. As the road leaves the side of the river you will approach some very sharp bends in the road. On one of these bends take a left turn sign-posted Appleby and Broughton.

Take the 2nd turning on your right sign-posted Winterton. The venue is $\frac{1}{4}$ mile on your right hand side. If you reach the mini roundabout you have gone too far.

From the A15 (Lincoln, Newark etc)

At the junction with the M180 take the 2nd exit at the roundabout signposted A18 Scunthorpe, Brigg and Broughton. Now proceed to ***


From the East (Grimsby etc)

Leave the M180 at junction 4 and take the 3rd exit at the roundabout signposted A18 Scunthorpe, Brigg and Broughton. Now proceed to ***

From the West (M1, M18, M62 etc)

Leave the M180 at junction 4 and take the 1st exit at the roundabout signposted A18 Scunthorpe, Brigg and Broughton. Now proceed to ***

*** At the next roundabout take the 2nd exit sign-posted **Broughton**. At the mini-roundabout in Broughton Village bear left sign-posted **scenic drive**. In approx. 2.5 miles you will reach a railway crossing. Care is needed here, as the crossing is very uneven. Having driven through the village of Appleby continue for approximately 2 miles, taking the 3rd turning on your left sign-posted **Winterton** (do not take the first turning on your left which is also sign-posted Winterton as this involves a difficult junction for caravans!). The venue is $\frac{1}{4}$ mile on your right hand side. If you reach the mini roundabout you have gone too far.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry Fees £2.00 per dog per class (£1.00 for club members)
3. No. Prize money
4. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests.
6. Not for Competition entries will be accepted from dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
7. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar ie. not attached by a ring.
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
13. Sponsors Pedigree Masterfoods
14. The latest time up to which dogs will be received and after which no dogs may be received except under exceptional and unforeseen circumstances and by special permission of the Management; or notice to the effect that dogs will be received at any time.
15. Standard Marking will apply as published in KC Year Book 2004/5
16. Jump heights will 2ft 6inches in all classes.
17. A judge at any Agility Test cannot compete or enter a dog at that event.
18. Withdrawal of dogs from Test
A dog will be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Test if it is: -
 - a) A bitch which is in season
 - b) Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease
 - c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent
 - d) Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal
 - e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing
19. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 7 days before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 30th January 2005
20. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
21. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
22. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
23. A dog must at the time of entry for the Competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitors' name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owners' property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
24. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
25. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except a registered guide dog for the blind or hearing dog for the deaf, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.
26. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club
27. In the event that the show has to be cancelled, Scunthorpe Obedience & Agility Training Club reserve the right to defray from entries received such costs, as they deem necessary.
28. Entry form must contain owners' signature & K.C. Registration Number.
29. No Refunds will be given in the event of incorrect monies submitted; it is the competitors' responsibility to check the entry before submission.
30. All dogs are entered at their owners' risk, whilst every care will be taken, Scunthorpe Obedience & Agility Training Club will not accept responsibility for the loss, damage or injury to persons, dogs or property.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

CHAMPIONSHIP CLASS: -Open to dogs having qualified to Advanced Status. To consist of 2 qualifying rounds of Standard Kennel Club Classes, 1 Agility Class and 1 Jumping Class and a final round of Agility to be held at the same show

Ballot for Championship Running Orders:'

- a) Agility Round and Jumping Round - A draw for the running order of the Agility and Jumping Rounds must be made prior to the Show. The relevant competitors must be notified before the day of the Show. The dogs must run in the order in which they are drawn.
- b) Final Agility Round - Dogs to run in reverse order to their combined placings at the end of the first two round.
- c) A dog must have the same handler for each round of the Championship Agility Class.

PEDIGREE TEAM RELAY: -This is an Agility competition and must include at least two items of contact equipment, All teams must consist of four dogs with separate handlers. Any number of teams from clubs may compete in heats, but only one team from each club may qualify for the final.

This is a team relay event and a suitable baton should be used which must remain behind the start line at all times. When the dog/handler returns to the start/finish, there will be a baton change between the handlers. No part of the next dog/handler must be over the start line; failure to observe this will incur a penalty of twenty points. The winning team from each heat will qualify for the final. Ten teams will compete in the final.

PEDIGREE PAIRS RELAY:- Two dogs with separate handlers will compete over the same course of twelve minimum, eighteen maximum obstacles. When the first dog/handler returns to the start/finish there will be a baton change between handlers. No part of the second dog/handler must be over the start line, failure to observe this will incur a penalty of twenty points. The baton must stay behind the start line at all times.

The course must include

Tyre, Weaving Poles, Pipe Tunnel and Collapsible Tunnel

No contact point obstacles to be used. Handlers may enter more than one dog in a heat; the first dog to qualify will go into the final. Handlers cannot compete in further heats for competition.

The first two pairs from each heat will go forward to the final.

STARTERS JUMPING:- For owners, handlers or dogs which have not won an Agility and/or a Jumping Class at a licensed Agility Test (Elementary excepted)

NOVICE AGILITY/NOVICE PAIRS:- Open to dogs which are not eligible for Senior or Advanced classes

INTERMEDIATE JUMPING:- Open to all except dogs eligible for Elementary or Starters Classes at a licensed Agility Test.

CRUFTS SENIOR AGILITY:- Open to dogs having won at least 2 first prizes, one of which must be an Agility Class, at a licensed Agility Test (Elementary and Starter wins excepted).

CRUFTS AGILITY COMPETITION 2006

The first 10 dogs in the Senior Agility Class at ten selected shows throughout the Country will collect points as follows:-

1st place - 10 points
4th place - 7 points
7th place - 4 points

2nd place - 9 points
5th place - 6 points
8th place - 3 points
10th place- 1 points

3rd place - 8 points
6th place - 5 points
9th place - 2 points

The first 16 dogs with the most point
after ten heats will be invited to Crufts
and the next 4 will be reserves
