

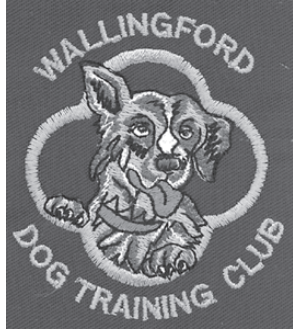

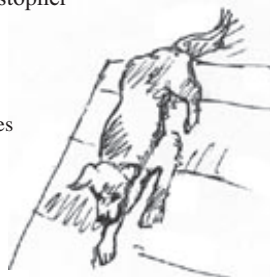

Definition of Classes

**Saturday

Mini/Midi Dogs

Mini dogs are defined as those measuring 15" (381mm) or under at the withers.

Midi dogs are defined as those measuring over 15" (381mm) and 17" (432mm) or under at the withers.

Open to owners, handlers or dogs that have not won an Agility and/or a Jumping Class at a licensed Agility test (Elementary excepted).

CLASS 2.

Jump Height: 15"

MINI STARTERS JUMPING

Open to owners, handlers or dogs that have not won an Agility and/or a Jumping Class at a licensed Agility test (Elementary excepted).

CLASS 3.

Jump Height: 15"

Judge: *Jennie Thorpe*

MINI INTERMEDIATE AGILITY

Open to all mini dogs except dogs eligible for Elementary and Starter classes at a licensed Agility test.

CLASS 4.

Jump Height: 15"

Judge: *Lisa Jeffery*

MINI INTERMEDIATE JUMPING

Open to all mini dogs except dogs eligible for Elementary and Starter classes at a licensed Agility test.

CLASS 5.

Jump Height: 20"

Judge: *Lisa Jeffery*

MIDI OPEN JUMPING

Open to all midi dogs.

CLASS 6.

Jump Height: 20"

Judge: *Jennie Thorpe*

MIDI OPEN AGILITY

Open to all midi dogs.



Please note that mini and midi dogs who do not yet possess a signed Kennel Club agility record book **may** be measured at the judges' discretion and if found to be oversized for their class, will be subsequently **disqualified**.

CLASS 7. **MINI/MIDI TEAM RELAY COMPETITION**

Jump Height: 15" This is a special relay team jumping competition for teams of four mini and / or midi dogs run over mini-height (15", 381mm) jumps. The **Judge: Tina Longland** competition will be held under Kennel Club Rules and Show Regulations H & H1 as in force at the date of the competition. Additional specific rules will apply as described below. Competitors entering this competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations.

Teams consist of four dogs handled by four separate handlers; two reserve dogs and handlers may be entered on the entry form for each team.

Only dogs entered in another class on the day of the competition may enter this team event. Dogs may only compete in one team.

The jumping course will be designed to flow and shall contain no fewer than 14 and no more than 18 obstacles. There will be two separate starting positions, A and B, each with a change-over line (of at least 4m) clearly marked on the ground. Handlers and dogs 1 and 3 start behind line A and finish behind line B. Handlers and dogs 2 and 4 start behind line B and finish behind line A. The inward and outward courses may be different, but both dogs starting from behind the same line must run the same course.

Two batons will be provided – one for each starting position. Incoming handlers will take the baton directly from the next handler such that the baton remains behind the change-over line. No part of the next handler or dog must be over the line (ie on the course) before the baton is correctly exchanged. Failure to comply with this, or an otherwise incorrect baton change (ie the baton is dropped), will incur a penalty of 20 points on each occasion.

For each dog eliminated, the team incurs a penalty of 50 points.

The team with the fastest cumulative time and the fewest faults, wins.

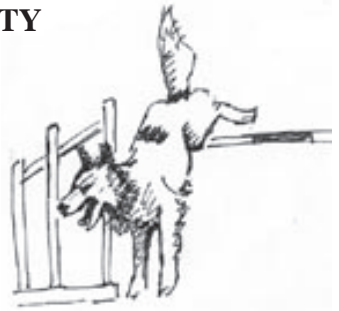
CLASS 9. **NOVICE JUMPING**

Jump Height: 2'6" Open to dogs which are not eligible for Senior or **Judges:** *Colin Harpley,* *Nigel Long,* *Tom Haddaway* Advanced classes.

CLASS 10. INTERMEDIATE AGILITY

Open to all except dogs eligible for Elementary and Starter classes at a licensed Agility test.



CLASS 11. SENIOR JUMPING

Jump Height: 2'6"

Open to dogs having won at least two first prizes, one of which must be an Agility class at a licensed Agility test, (Elementary and Starters wins excepted).

CLASS 12. **THE NATURES MENU TEAM CHALLENGE (Qualifier)**

Jump Height: 2'6"
Judge: *Tony Poole /
Vic Christopher*



The Natures Menu Team Challenge is an Open Jumping competition for teams of four standard dogs and handlers, run as a relay over a simple jumping course. The competition is designed as a fast event with great spectator appeal; open to all abilities of dogs and handlers.

There are **ten qualifying heats**. The top two teams from each heat will qualify for a **Grand Final**, 20 teams (80 finalists) compete for the overall trophy and title of **'The Natures Menu Team Challenge Winners'**.

1. The competition is for Standard height dogs and is classified under Kennel Club Regulations as 'Open' and 'Special'. The competition will be held under Kennel Club Rules and Show Regulations H & H1 as in force at the date of the competition. Additional specific rules will apply as described below. Competitors entering this competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations.
2. If the entry for a heat exceeds the Kennel Club limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally split and another judge appointed for the second part. The winning team from each part will be regarded as the two qualifying teams from that heat. Sponsor's rosettes will be provided to the top 3 placed teams in both parts.
3. All teams must consist of four dogs handled by four separate handlers. **Only the handlers and dogs (or their two reserves) who are named on the original entry form, may compete in that heat.**
4. Alterations to team entries (deletions, additions or substitutions of dogs or handlers) are not permitted after the closing date for entries of the show hosting the heat. Teams requiring deletions or additions after this date may only run as Not For Competition (N.F.C.) in that heat.
5. Handlers may compete in more than one team in any given heat, providing that they handle a different dog in each team. In the event of a handler running in two qualifying teams in one heat then the highest placed team only will be deemed to have qualified from that heat. Dogs may only compete in one team in any given heat.
6. The course must be designed to flow. It must not contain contact equipment.
7. The course must contain two change-over lines, clearly marked on the ground, each with a minimum gate width of 4m. Handlers/dogs 1 & 3 start behind line A and finish behind line B. Handlers/dogs 2 & 4 start behind line B and finish behind line A. The inward and outward courses can be different, but both dogs from behind the same line must run the same course.
8. The course each dog is required to negotiate shall contain no less than 14 and no more than 20 obstacles, excluding the change-over lines.
9. This is a team relay event and suitable batons must be provided which must remain behind the relevant change-over lines (i.e. off-course.) When a handler/dog crosses a line to complete their run there will be a baton change with the next handler which must be completed behind the line (i.e. off-course.) No part of the next handler or dog must be over the line (i.e. on the course) before the baton is correctly exchanged. Failure to comply with this, or an otherwise incorrect baton change, will incur a penalty of 50 points on each occasion. A 'line steward' may be appointed by the judge to oversee change-overs on one line if required.
10. For each dog an elimination on the course incurs a penalty of 100 points.
11. The team with the fastest cumulative time and the least faults, wins. The top two teams from each heat qualify for the final. Once they have qualified for the final, neither handlers nor dogs may enter or compete in any remaining heats for that qualifying season except as Not For Competition. (N.F.C.)
12. Only handlers and dogs who are members of an original qualifying team, or the two named reserves on the entry form, will be allowed to compete in the final. Changes are at the organiser's discretion and only under exceptional circumstances.
13. Whilst competing in the final, all teams are required to wear the sponsored clothing provided.
14. In the event of a team not being available to run in the final, a reserve team may be called in strict order of merit, from the heat in which the qualifying team qualified.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Directions: Please take care, the junction at M4 /A34 has changed; there is no roundabout on the A34. From Junction 13 on the M4 and the M4 exit from the A34, follow signs for Chieveley, then follow the signs to Hermitage from the roundabout until you pick up the Newbury Showground signs. Go past the first entrance to the showground and turn right into the main entrance to the Newbury Showground.

Camping: Camping is available on Friday night (admission from 4pm to 9.30pm) and on Saturday night admission up to 9.30pm payable @ £5 per unit per night. Shower facilities are available. Only campers who have paid for their camping in advance of the show will be admitted. The following safety rules must be obeyed:

- a) There will be a minimum space of 20 feet between units.
- b) Motor vehicles will be parked to the side of the units.
- c) Open fires/barbecues ARE NOT PERMITTED.
- d) All units must carry a fire extinguisher and have a bucket of water at the front of the unit at all times.

Refreshments: Hot and cold refreshments will be available throughout the show.

Rubbish: Please ensure that you clear up after your dogs and use the bags provided. Poo bags will be available in the exercise area.

Vets: In the unfortunate circumstance that you should need a vet please report to the secretary's tent and you will be escorted to the Veterinary Clinic. The Veterinary Surgeons on call are **O'Gorman, Slater and Main, Donnington Grove Vet Surgery.**

Injury/Illness: First aid cover will be present during show hours on both days.

Remember:

- Keep your dogs on leads unless competing or in a designated exercise area.
- Good venues are hard to find so you **must** clean up after your dogs.
- Wear your ring number visibly when competing.
- Dogs may compete with no collar, or a flat close-fitting collar (nothing dangling).

Rules



1. The Committee reserve the right to refuse entry.
2. The Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge or judges if required.
3. Should circumstances so dictate, the Society, in consultation with the Judge, may alter arrangements as necessary.
4. All dogs will be entered at this show at their owner's risk and whilst every care will be taken the Committee will not accept responsibility for any loss, damage or injury however caused to dogs, persons or property whilst at the show.
5. A dog must, at the time of entry for Competition, be registered as required by Kennel Club Rules and Regulations in the Competitor's name (or registration or transfer applied for).
In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the Directors and the Secretary of the Limited company will jointly be considered as the competitor for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to The Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
6. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/ event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor / competitor.
7. All wins up to and including 7 days before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class.
8. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests.
9. No animal other than the one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except a registered guide dog for the blind or hearing dog for the deaf, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Committee.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Competition is forbidden.
11. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
12. Puppies under 4 months of age are not allowed in the main show area.
13. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from an Agility Test if it is:
 - a. A bitch which is in season
 - b. Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
14. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
15. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
16. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
17. Dogs must not wear any type of slip or half slip collar or lead. A flat close fitting collar with nothing attached by a ring is permitted.
18. Standard marking applies except where stated otherwise.
19. All competitors are required to clear up after any dogs under their control at all times within the precinct of the Show. **COMPETITORS FAILING TO DO SO WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE THE SHOW AND WILL BE REPORTED TO THE KENNEL CLUB.**
20. Toys must not be thrown in the exercise area as it does distract and excite other dogs.
