## Welfare of Dogs

An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their $\operatorname{dog}(\mathrm{s})$ are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

## Eligibility:

In accordance with Kennel Club Rules, large dogs who have not competed before ${ }^{\text {st }}$ January 2006 and ALL Small and Medium dogs must have been officially measured before competing at a Kennel Club licensed agility show.

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility class or three first places in Jumping classes at Kennel club licensed Agility shows. NB Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.

| Grade 2 | Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7, and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three <br> first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from <br> Grade 1. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class. |
| :--- | :--- |
| Grade 3 | Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club <br> licensed Agility Shows and Dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4,5,6 or 7 |
| Grade 4 | Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility class or three first places in Jumping classes at Grade 3 or or <br> elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows and are not eligible for Grade 3,5,6 or <br> 7 |
| Grade 5 | Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility class or three first places in Jumping classes at Grade 4 or <br> elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel club licensed Agility shows and are not eligible for Grade 3,4,6,or 7 |
| Grade 6 | Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility class or three <br> first places in Jumping classes at Grade 5 or elected to progress on points from Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed agility <br> shows and are not eligible for grades 3,4,5 or 7 |
| Grade 7 | Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 6 at Kennel club licensed Agility shows. Two <br> first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) classes. |

Any Size is for dogs that are not competing in any other class at this show. Jump height 35 cm for all dogs.

## YKC TEAM AGILITY - Final to be held at Crufts 2010

a) Teams must represent a KC club or group of clubs. All teams should consist of 5 dogs handled by 5 separate members. The five handlers may be from different clubs.
b) Handlers may compete in more than one team from the same club/s but must handle a different dog in each team. Once a handler has qualified, he/she may not compete for a different team for the same year.
c) Handlers must be YKC members. They may handle any KC registered dog, providing that another person is not handling the dog at Crufts.
d) Handlers must be 6-17 years on the day of the competition. One team member may be between $18-25$ years.
e) A team may consist of mixed height dogs, each dog to compete over standard height equipment for its classification.
f) The first team from each heat will qualify.
g) In the event of only one team entering a heat, that team will run in the heat and providing that no more than two dogs are eliminated will qualify
h) The course, set by the judge, will contain at least two pieces of contact equipment. Each dog will be individual timed (not relay), standard marking will apply and should elimination occur, scoring will continue with 50 faults for each elimination added to the final score. The combined score/time of the best 4 out of 5 dogs in the team will decide the results.
i) A judge may alter the running order of the dogs within a team depending on the height mix.

Once a team has qualified the dogs and handlers should remain as per entry form. Special permission to substitute will be required in writing from the YKC.

## Eagle Pack Annual Agility Starters Cup <br> Rules \& Regulations

- Eligibility for competition is under the Kennel Club classification and is open to dogs Working Grades One and Two Large Dog Agility.
- The competition must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the event.
- Competitors entering the competition must be deemed to have agreed to abide by those Rules and Regulations
- Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Final.
- Each heat is open to all competitors eligible for Grades 1 \& 2 Large Dogs.
- Qualifiers may enter further heats for competition, providing they are still eligible for Grades 1 and 2.
- Handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the Eagle Pack representative on the day of the show of this fact.
- The competition will consist of approx'10 heats with the first 3 placed dogs from each heat going through to the final. In the event of someone qualifying more than once for the final, the next placed eligible dog will be taken from the appropriate heat.
- Should someone be unable to attend the Final the next placed eligible Dog may be invited at the sponsor's discretion
- Surrogate Handlers will not be allowed.

## The Agility Club Starters Agility Challenge 2009/2010 Rules Supported by Pedigree



The Agility Club Large, Medium and Small Starters Challenge, supported by Pedigree, is a Combined Grade 1-L Agmity crass.
The competition will be run under the relevant Kennel Club Regulations in force at that time. All handlers will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations.

Each Heat is open to all Grade 1-2 dogs of the correct size for each heat, but only those handled by an Agility Club member at the time of competing may qualify for the Final.

The competition will normally consist of between ten and fifteen Heats. The two highest placed Agility Club members in each Heat will go through to the Final, subject to the restriction that both handler and dog may only qualify once for each height Final.
The show secretary must be informed if a handler or dog that has already qualified for the same height Final is placed in a subsequent Heat.
Awards: Rosettes to 15 th for Large and to $10^{\text {th }}$ for Medium and Small classes Trophies to $3^{\text {rd }}$ place in all 3 heats. HANDLERS WHO ARE MEMBERS OF 'THE AGILITY CLUB' SHOULD ENSURE THAT THIS FACT IS RECORDED ON THE SCRIBE SHEET BEFORE THEY RUN.

The Final will be held at the Agility Club Show, Newbury Showground, Berkshire, in July 2010.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at K.C. licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with K.C. Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The Reg Number/Authority to Compete Number will be required for each entry.
2. ENTRY FEES - £2.40 per dog per class, $£ 12.00$ per YKC Team. Helping Dordale Members show reductions apply to those paying full membership, \& to their dogs currently training with Dordale, also for those dogs who have trained with Dordale for more than 3 yrs in the past \& are now over 8 yrs old $£ 1.00$ per class. Internet entries will be accepted via www.iShowServices.com
Prize money - not applicable.
The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests.
Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be K.C. registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show, the same applies to the car park, exercise area and camping area.
3. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar, ie not attached by a ring.
4. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge, the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
5. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
6. Sponsors - The Kennel Club, Agility Club/Pedigree, Eagle Pack, H.J.M. Training, Whiting Landscape, Just for Pets, A.J.M. Pet Products Ltd, Classic Rosettes
7. It is the handlers' responsibility to report to their class in good time to compete in the order allocated to them. The latest time up to which they will be able to compete will be at the judge's discretion.
Standard Marking will apply, as per Kennel Club Regs H \& H(1).
Heights of jumps, Large 65 cm , Medium 45 cm , Small 35 cm .
Competition for small dogs - dogs measuring 35 cm or under at the withers.
Competition for medium dogs - dogs measuring over 35 cm and measuring 43 cm or under at the withers.
Competition for large dogs - dogs measuring over 43 cm at the withers.
A judge at any Agility Test cannot compete or enter a dog at that event.
Withdrawal of dogs from Test. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition, and removed from the Test if it is:-
(a) A bitch in season.
(b) Suffering from any infection or contagious disease.
(c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent. (d) Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal. (e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
8. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at the particular show, after the entry for that show as been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show manager at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class/es for the next grade. The dog will be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade.
9. Should circumstances so dictate, the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
10. All dogs at the time of entry for the Competition, must be registered by the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations in the competitor's name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry, having been entered at a competition, may compete as the new owner's property, provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form. Any change of handler must be entered on competition slip before run.
11. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except a registered guide dog for the blind or a hearing dog for the deaf, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.
12. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before any entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the competitor.
13. No dog suffering from infectious or contagious disease, or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the show may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under KC Rule A42.
14. No washing out of toilets or filling any waste container will be allowed at, by, or near any drinking water tap at this show.
15. Any cheque returned by the bank will be passed back to the drawer, and will incur charges.
16. All persons and dogs entered in the show do so at their and their owner's risk, and whilst every care will be taken, the Committee and the owners of the ground will not accept any responsibility for loss, damage or injury, however caused, to persons, dogs or property.
17. In the event of circumstances making it necessary to cancel the show, DATS reserve the right to defray expenses incurred by deducting such expenses from entry fees received.
18. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
19. A practice ring will be available if space allows.
20. Parents are reminded that they are responsible for the behaviour and good conduct of their children. All children must be under adult supervision at all times.
21. No more than 2 dogs per handler off lead at any time in exercise area. Dogs must be on a lead and the lead attached to a responsible person at all times whilst around the rings, camping and car parking area.
22. CAMPING $£ 15$ per unit for the weekend - Limited = one tent or one caravan or one motor home per unit. NOT TRANSFERABLE. All units should have their own fire extinguisher. No chemical toilets allowed at the drinking water points. No unauthorised parking or camping allowed anywhere. Roadways to be kept clear. Dogs must not be loose unsupervised in gardens. May we remind you camping has been allocated to you on the basis you have agreed to help for 1 hour Sat \& Sun.
23. Day Parking. Please park as directed. Keep speed to less than 5 mph . No tethered dogs to be left unsupervised.
24. STRICTLY NO BARBECUES!!!!!!!!!!!
25. It is a Kennel Club rule that you clean up after your dogs. Please put the waste in the bins provided. Do not throw poo bags in the skip.
26. Goods may not be sold within the precincts of the show without permission.
