2009 CRUFTS TEAM FLYBALL

These rules are for the Crufts Team Flyball event and should be run in conjunction with the specific flyball regulations H(2).

This is a team competition (knockout). Two teams will compete against each other on separate equipment. The best two of three runs will decide the winner to go into the next round in the heats. In the final at Crufts 2010 the best of three runs will decide the winner to go into the next round.

Each team shall consist of four handlers and dogs plus two reserves. A club may enter more than one team, and a club may qualify more than one team for the final. No handler or dog can enter/compete in more than one team. All dogs entering in KC licensed Flyball competitions must be Kennel Club registered.

The two highest placed teams will be invited from each heat to compete in the semi final/final at Crufts 2010. Teams that have previously qualified cannot enter further heats for competition.

Flyball boxes to be used in this competition will be the commercially available flat fronted type and all teams will provide their own flyball box and tennis balls for any Crufts flyball competition entered which may include the final at Crufts 2010. Clubs holding heats will be expected to have a spare approved box available should it be required. The host club will also provide all other equipment needed to run the event eg. Hurdles (12"/30.9cm) high, backstops, etc.

This competition is governed by Kennel Club guideline rules for Flyball in force at the time of the heat/final. Only handlers who are members of the original team, or named as reserves on the entry form, will be allowed to compete in the final at the organiser's discretion (exceptional circumstances).

Kennel Club Rules and Regulations

- Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility/Flyball event must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
- 2. Amount of entry £12.50 per team.
- 3. Prize money is not on offer
- 4. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 5. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible to compete at this Kennel Club licensed Show
- 6. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dog's aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
- 7. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
- 9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the event.

- 10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. Not attached by a ring.
- 11. Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
- 12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
- 13. Judges at this event may not enter for competition a dog that is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at this event.
- 14. Withdrawal of dogs from Competition A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from this event if it is: a). A bitch that is in season. b). Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease. c). Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent. d). Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal. e). Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
- 15. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
- 16. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 17. If the show is cancelled for any reason expenses might be deducted before any refund of entry fees.
- 18. A dog must at the time of entry for the Competition be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitors' name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owners' property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
- 19. Animals in Event No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of this event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the event by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the event, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
- 20. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the competitor.
- 21. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete.

 Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
- 22. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog when competing.
- 23. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his authorized agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.

KENNEL CLUB NOTICE

Your dog is vulnerable and ATRISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

SITE INFORMATION

Camping is only on the designated site and is Limited to 200 units.

IF CAMPING IS FULL YOUR ENTRY WILL STILL BE PROCESSED UNLESS YOU INDICATE OTHERWISE BY TICKING THE RELEVANT SPACE ON THE ENTRY FORM

The Cost per Camping Unit is £16.00 for the weekend (Friday & Saturday night ONLY).

- Camping admissions are from 3pm on Friday 4th September 2009. Units will be refused entry if arriving prior to this time unless previously agreed
- 2 If you arrive after 10pm the Camping stewards will be off duty so gate will be closed and you may not gain entry. You can move on to the main site in the morning.
- The size of the pitch includes one caravan and awning and one vehicle.
- 4 For Health and Safety reasons please park according to instructions given.
- 5 Roadways MUST be kept clear.
- 6 Each camping unit MUST HAVE an appropriate fire extinguisher and bucket of water outside.
- 7 P.A. System: this will not be in use until 9.00am
- 8 Information Point: this will be situated near the Secretary's tent. Prize givings will also take place at this point.
- 9 Generators: these must not be used between 10pm and 7am in consideration of your neighbours.
- 10 Chemical toilets must only be emptied into the Elsan provided. DO NOT empty chemical toilets into the show toilets or wash them out at the fresh water standpipes.
- 11 DO NOT put Nappies and other solid waste into the show toilets please.
- 12 **No** showers are available.
- 13 Water is available at standpipes around the site.
- 14 Containers for rubbish and poo bags will be provided.
- 15 Barbecues are not allowed anywhere on the show site, Gas Barbecues are however permitted.
- 16 Polo will be taking place in various pitches on the Estate over the weekend. Please avoid these areas at all times.

Exercise Area will be clearly marked. There is a public right of way through the site. Please keep your dogs on leads except in the exercise area. Poo bags must be put in the skips provided for that purpose. You will be asked to leave the show-ground if you do not pick up.

The dog exercise area is not a childrens' play area. Please supervise your children at all times

Directions to Cirencester Park from the M4.

- 1. Exit the M4 motorway at JUNCTION 15 (Swindon East).
- 2. Taking a RIGHT turn at the motorway roundabout, Proceed NORTH up the A419 to Cirencester.
- 3. Exit the dual carriageway at the sign marked 'CIRENCESTER INDUSTRIAL ESTATE'
- 4. Follow signs to the Royal Agricultural College and Stroud (you will go over 4 roundabouts)
- 5. You will now be on the A419 to MINCHINHAMPTON & STROUD
- 6. The entrance to the park is approximately 1 mile from the last roundabout on the RIGHT. You will notice Prestbury Park Agility signs opposite the entrance which is on the right.
- 7. Continue to follow the signs off the main road which takes you along a one-way system through the estate to the show.

From the M5

- 1. Leave the M5 at Junction 11a to Cirencester on the A417 to the Airballoon roundabout.
- 2. Take the second exit towards Cirencester and continue on the A417 over the next roundabout signed Cirencester and M4
- 3. After approximately 7 miles exit at the junction signed Stow and Cirencester and at the roundabout take the 4th exit A429 towards Cirencester.
- 4. Go straight over the next roundabout.
- 5. At the next roundabout take the 1st exit following signs for the Royal Agricultural College (RAC) and Stroud on the
- 6. You will go over three more roundabouts.
- 7. After the roundabout by the hospital you will go up a hill still following the A419, take the second exit at the roundabout at the top of the hill on the A419 to Stroud, you will pass the RAC on the left
- 8. After another mile the entrance to the park is on the right hand side with signage on the opposite side of the road

Please ensure that you adhere to the **20 MPH** speed limit set in the park and follow all of the estate rules as documented on the back of your ring plan.
