### **Height Classification of Dogs**

**Small:** Dogs measuring 35cm or under at the withers.

**Medium:** Dogs measuring over 35cm & 43cm or under at the withers.

**Large:** Dogs measuring over 43 cm at the withers.

## **ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULE OF CLASSES**

In accordance with KC Rules, large dogs that have not competed before 1<sup>st</sup> January 2006 & ALL Small & Medium dogs must have been officially measured before competing at a KC licensed agility show.

### **STANDARD CLASSES**

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade).

#### **Grade 1 (Elementary)**

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class. The three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

#### **Grade 2 (Starters)**

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7, and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class..

#### **Grade 3 (Graduate)**

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

#### **Grade 4 (Novice)**

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

#### **Grade 5 (Intermediate)**

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

#### **Grade 6 (Senior)**

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

#### **Grade 7 (Advanced)**

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

**Celebration Connection:** These are special classes. Competitors must run within 20 before or 20 after their running orders, unless with the permission of the Judge. This class will take priority over all other classes.

**Veteran Jumping:-** Open to dogs aged 7 and over not entered in any other class over this weekend. Jumps will be set at 45cm and there will be no weave poles or tyre in the course.

**Junior handler Agility:-** Open to all large, medium and small dogs grades 1-7.

Class 47: Handlers must be **Under 9** years of age on the day of the show to compete.

Class 48: Handlers must be **9 years of age or over and under 15** years on the day of the show

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows must be registered with the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification & Registration B. The registration number / Authority To Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry fees are as detailed on the Entry Form.
3. Prizes – no monetary prizes are on offer. Awards for each class are listed in the awards section of the schedule.
4. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests.
6. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for registered dogs, aged four calendar months or over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
7. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel, as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
13. Sponsorship - Sponsors for the show will be listed on the schedule of classes next to each class that they are sponsoring.
14. Kennel Club standard marking Regulations will apply as published in the Kennel Club Yearbook in use at the time of the show, including any amendments introduced by the Kennel Club.
15. Height of jump obstacles will be as follows: Large dogs 65cm, Medium dogs 45cm, Small dogs 35cm.
16. a. Competition for Large dogs – those dogs eligible to compete in classes for large dogs are those measuring over 43cm at the withers  
b. Competition for Medium dogs – those dogs eligible to compete in classes for medium dogs are those measuring over 35cm & measuring 43cm or under at the withers  
c. Competition for Small dogs – those dogs eligible to compete in competitions for small dogs are those measuring 35cm or under at the withers.
17. Judges at an Agility Test may not enter for competition a dog that is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Test at which they are judging.
18. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Test if it is:-
  - a. A bitch which is in season.
  - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
  - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
  - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
  - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
19. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees. **All wins up to and including Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> March shall be counted when entering for any class.**
20. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
21. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
22. Should circumstances so dictate the society, in consultation with the judge may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
23. Dogs must at the time of entry for competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the competitor's name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
24. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.
25. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the Show can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club registration number or Authority to compete number will be returned to the competitor.
26. No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to competition may compete. Competitors infringing the regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42
27. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring
28. Please clean up after your dog and place in bins provided. Anyone knowingly not doing so may be asked to leave the venue and forfeit any remaining class entries.
29. All dogs entered at the show must be entered on the relevant entry form, including not for competition dogs on the back.
30. **No camping units will be allowed on the showground before 12 noon on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> April and ALL units should be off the showground by 10am on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> April. Only one camping space may be booked per person unless pre arranged with the show secretary. Camping may be limited.**
31. Rosettes and trophies will not be forwarded.
32. In the event of abandonment of the Show though circumstances beyond our control, the organising group may defray such expenses from the entry fees to cover the cost of the Show preparation.
33. Campers must leave a 20ft gap between units and be equipped with own fire extinguishers.
34. Camping passes must be prominently displayed at all times.
35. No barbecues or open air cooking on the showground.

36. No refunds due to incorrect entries or requests for special running orders will be entertained

### **Qualifier Rules and Regulations**

All events must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club rules H & H(1) in force at the time of the event. Competitors entering any competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by regulations.

All heats must take place at Kennel Club licensed shows

All Kennel Club supported competitions should be judged using standard marking.

If the entry for a heat exceeds the Kennel Club limit for a judge in a day, then the class will be equally split and another judge appointed for the second part. Qualifiers and reserves from that heat will be taken in equal proportion from each part, giving the total number originally required from that heat. Rosettes and awards remain unchanged if the heat is split.

Dogs entered in any heats must be eligible for the competition entered and judges retain the right to check the height of any dog or ask to see the height stated in the Kennel Club record book

Competitors can qualify for Small, Medium or Standard final but it must be with different dogs. The first final a handler qualifies a dog for will be the final that particular dog competes in at Olympia

### **The Kennel Club Olympia Agility Stakes**

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the semi-finals. Handlers may only qualify one dog for the final which will be the first dog qualified at the semi-final. Once a dog has qualified for the Final/Semi final further heats may be entered for competition.

The first five previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will go forward to one of the two semi-finals at the City of Birmingham show at Stoneleigh. The first eighteen dogs from each semi-final will qualify for the final at Olympia.

The 36 dogs who qualify for Olympia will be invited to compete in a further semi final at Olympia. The top ten highest placed dogs in the semi final will qualify for the evening grand final at Olympia

This competition will be classified as grades 6-7 combined Agility and judged under Kennel Club regulations for standard classes

### **The Kennel Club Olympia Novice Agility Stakes**

This competition will be classified as grades 3-5 combined Agility and Judged under Kennel Club regulations for standard classes.

Dogs should be eligible to enter a Novice class at the time of qualifying for the semi-final. Any subsequent wins gained by the dog will not alter its eligibility to compete in the semi-final

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the semi-finals. Handlers may only qualify one dog for the final which will be the highest placed dog at the semi-final. Once a dog has qualified for the semi-final/final, further heats may be entered for competition. Although any placing in these heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the final/semi-final.

The first three previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat or split class will go forward to one of the two semi-finals at the City of Birmingham show at Stoneleigh. The first eighteen dogs from each semi final will qualify for the final at Olympia.

The 36 dogs who qualify for Olympia will be invited to compete in a further semi final at Olympia. The top ten highest placed dogs in the Olympia semi final will qualify for the evening grand final at Olympia

It is most important that handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog inform the Show secretary on the day of the show of this fact.

### **CELEBRATION LARGE DOG ADVANCED POWER AND SPEED**

**This class is only open for dogs eligible for Grade 7 Advanced competitions.**

Handlers may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the final. Once a dog has qualified for the final further heats may be entered for competition.

The first 4 places from each heat will be invited to compete in the final.

It is most important that handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the show secretary on the day of the show of this fact.

The first section of the course will contain all the contact equipment plus the weaving poles, two rising spread jumps at maximum width and height, and the long jump at maximum length.

**This first section must be timed. It is recommended that a generous maximum time be applied.**

The second section of the course will consist only of single pole hurdles, and will be against the clock. The object of the class is for the dog to negotiate the first part of the course clear, before proceeding across the start line to commence the second section of the course, which should be set as a fast speed jumping course.

#### **NOTE**

Only dogs that are clear on the first section can attempt the second section. Normal judging rules apply except that on the first section, handlers may line up their dogs before taking any obstacle without penalty. The winner will be decided in the usual way of the fastest time with the least faults.

It is advisable for judges to note that the original intention was for the jumping part of the course to be fast and free flowing to produce an exciting finish.

### **CELEBRATION CONNECTION**

**This event must be classified as Grades 6 and 7 at least. Grades 3, 4, or 5 may be added at the secretary's discretion according to the anticipated entry.**

Large dog heats the first 4 places from each heat will be invited to compete in the final.

Small and Medium dog heats the winner from each heat will be invited to compete in the final.

In the event that a heat is split the first 2 from each part will qualify regardless of how many parts.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a Heat, but may only qualify one dog for the final. The first dog that a handler qualifies with will run in the final. Qualifiers may enter further heats for competition providing they are eligible.

It is most important that handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the show secretary on the day of the show of this fact.

## Large, Medium & Small Celebration Connection Rules

### Objective

Gain as many points as possible ( **max 32** ) in the given course time ( set by judge ).  
Then stop the timing in the quickest time

### How

Complete 3 different jump's successfully then a bonus obstacles. Until all 4 bonus's have been attempted or you run out of time.

### Rules for obstacle placement

1. Tyre and Dogwalk **must not** be used
2. Connecting Jumps: min 6, max 9 (excluding judges bonus )
3. Connecting jumps must be place within the 4 bonus obstacles
4. Connecting jumps must not be a spread jump
5. Only one bonus obstacle may be placed on each side of the ring
6. Bonus obstacle ( 1 ) weaves
7. Bonus obstacle ( 2 ) jump + see saw ( jump must be aligned straight on to see saw )
8. Bonus obstacle ( 3 ) the A frame
9. Bonus obstacle ( 4 ) is a combination invented by the judge containing 1, 2, or 3 obstacles. The judge may stipulate in which order obstacles are taken. Spreads may be used but only jumped in the correct direction
10. Start and finish obstacles are for timing only and will not count. ( they may or may not be the same obstacle. Jump, tunnel or table)
11. The start and finish can be inside the bonus obstacles, timing permitting
12. In the event of the whistle sounding when a dogs in committed to an obstacle or within a bonus section the points will be award upon successful completion
13. Judges will need a scribe and a timer as per the old Gamblers and 2 whistles

### Points

Jumps 1 point , Bonus 5 points each

### Course time

Set by judge

### Rule for competitors

1. The Dog must start the timing.
2. In the event of the dog running past the start obstacle you must put your dog directly back over the start obstacle without touch or re setting up ( this may be done in either direction).
3. The start obstacle does not count, it is there for timing purposes only .This obstacle will not be faulted. (If it is a jump it cannot be part of any connecting 3 )
4. Refusals will not be marked
5. Missed Weaves pole entry or faults during the weaves count as a bonus failure (see rule 13)
6. Missed contact will counts as a bonus failure
7. Faults in the judge's bonus will also count as a bonus failure.
8. 3 different jumps must be completed correctly before attempting a bonus
9. After attempting a bonus the same jumps may be used again
10. Bonus's may be taken in any order provided they are proceeded by 3 correctly completed jumps
11. Jumps may be taken from either side
12. Jump numbers are for identification only
13. Each bonus may only be attempted once ( a failed bonus counts as an attempt). **If in the opinion of the judge your dog attempts a bonus or part of a bonus and that bonus is not completed successfully this will result in a failed bonus.**
14. The dog must stop the timing after either successfully completing the 4 bonus's or when the time limit is reached, indicated by a whistle blowing ( whichever comes first )
15. The dog must also stop the timing when a round is ended due to elimination ( indicated by a whistle blowing)
16. The round will end when the timing is stopped
17. Fallen jumps will not be replaced

### Elimination

When eliminated dogs must leave the ring via the finish obstacle as quick as possible to gain a time. Failure to do so will result in no score being recorded.

Obstacles taken on the way to the finish will not be faulted.

All points gained up to the elimination will stand.

**Eliminations will result in the following cases**

1. The Dog touching a bonus obstacle before completing 3 jumps correctly
2. Jumping 4 jumps in succession
4. The Dog touching the same bonus twice
5. Only 2 jumps left standing
6. Jumping a spread obstacle the wrong way
7. The Dog touching a bonus obstacle or jump or jumping an obstacle before starting the time
8. Jumping the same jump twice in a connection of 3 without doing a bonus

**Note: taking the judges bonus obstacles in the wrong order or direction will not result in elimination, but no bonus points will be awarded. ( spread jump excepted ).**

**DIRECTIONS TO VENUE**

Leave the **M25** at junction 7/8 onto the **M23** towards Gatwick. At junction 10, turn onto the **A264** toward East Grinstead. At the second roundabout turn right (brown sign here reads South of England show ground) onto the **B2028** follow this road for about 6 miles towards Ardingly. The venue is on the right and is clearly signposted. If camping please use the second entrance (Prince's Gate). **No entry before 12 noon on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> April.** If you are day parking use the third entrance (red gate). Please leave the venue tidy and by **10am on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> April.**
