**CLASSES MAY BE SPLIT AND EXTRA JUDGES APPOINTED IF ENTRIES ARE LARGE**

**THE AGILITY CLUB STARTERS CHALLENGE 2010 supported by Pedigree**  
**2009/2010 Rules**

1. The classes should be billed appropriately as either The Agility Club Large Starters Challenge, supported by Pedigree, The Agility Club Medium Starters Challenge, supported by Pedigree or the Agility Club Small Starters Challenge, supported by Pedigree and scheduled accordingly as a Large, Medium or Small combined Grade 1-2 Agility class.
2. The competition will be run under the relevant KC Regulations in force at that time. All handlers will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations.
3. Each Heat is open to all Grade 1-2 dogs of the correct size, but only those handled by an Agility Club member at the time of competing may qualify for the Final.
4. The competition will normally consist of between ten and fifteen Heats. The two highest placed **Agility Club** members in each Heat will go through to the Final, subject to the restriction that both handler and dog may only qualify once for each height Final.
5. The show secretary must be informed if a handler or dog that has already qualified for the same height Final is placed in a subsequent Heat.

**ANYSIZE JUMPING (Special)**

1. This class is for dogs, Grades 1 to 7, who are unable to jump their full height for any reason.
2. The jumps will be set at micro height for the first part of the class and then at small height for the remainder of the class.
3. Handlers may choose which height they wish to jump on the day.
4. There will be no tyre, spread jump or weaves in this class.
5. Dogs entered in this class may not enter any other class on the same day – except for Geriatric Agility.

**GERIATRIC AGILITY (Special)**

1. This is a Special class open only to handlers aged 60 and over with **Large Medium or Small** height dogs, Grades 1-7. Dogs who are unable to jump their full height for any reason may be entered at any height you choose.
2. There is a reduced o.a.p. rate for this class of £1.50 – free entry to all over 80s and also to anyone who is accompanied by both parents.
3. The course will be simple to remember – probably just up and down, without traps.
4. There will be no course time – within the hour preferred.
5. Extra large numbers will indicate the course.
6. Appropriate prizes
7. Oxygen, nurses, incontinence pads and zimmer frames will be available if required.
8. Sanatogen, Viagra and similar stimulants are banned.



**THE KENNEL CLUB OLYMPIA LARGE DOG NOVICE AGILITY STAKES**

1. This competition will be classified as combined Grades 3, 4 and 5 and judged under the Kennel Club regulations for standard classes.
2. Dogs should be eligible to enter a Grade 3, 4 or 5 class at the time of qualifying for the semi-final. Any subsequent wins gained by the dog will not alter its eligibility to compete in the semi-final or final.
3. Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the semi-finals. Handlers may only qualify one dog for the final which will be the highest placed dog at the semi-final. Once a dog has qualified for the semi-final/final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the final/semi finals.
4. The first three previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat or split class will go forward to one of the two semi-finals at the City of Birmingham Championship Dog Show at Stoneleigh. The first eighteen dogs from each semi-final will qualify for the final at Olympia.
5. The 36 dogs who qualify for Olympia will be invited to compete in a further semi final at Olympia. The top ten highest placed dogs in the Olympia semi final will qualify for the evening grand final at Olympia.
6. Those dogs eligible to compete in Novice Large Dog Agility competitions are those measuring over 430mm (1 foot 5 inches) at the withers.



**THE KENNEL CLUB OLYMPIA LARGE DOG ABC AGILITY STAKES**

1. This competition is a **special** agility competition open to all dogs **excluding** Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and any of their crosses. In the event of a dispute over the parentage of a dog, a decision will be left to the judge's discretion.
2. Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for Large dogs are those measuring over 430mm (1ft 5 in) at the withers and open to dogs in grades 1-7 and judged under the KC regulations for standard classes.
3. Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the semi-finals. Handlers may only qualify one dog for the final which will be the highest placed dog at the semi-final. Once a dog has qualified for the semi-final/final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the final/semi finals.
4. The first four previously unqualified placed dogs will be invited from each heat to compete in the semi-final which will be held at The City of Birmingham Championship Dog Show at Stoneleigh. The first ten highest placed dogs at the semi-final will be invited to compete in the finals to be held at Olympia.

## **ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULE OF CLASSES:**

This classification should apply to competitions for large, medium and small dogs.

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open Agility Shows (i.e. Limited Agility Shows, special classes and invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round will count towards grade progression. Societies may schedule classes other than those defined below. The eligibility for "Special" classes must be defined by the Society and included in the schedule. The word "Special" must be included in the title of the class.

Agility classes to include contact points and Jumping classes where there are not contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

**Class Structure.** A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

**Progression.** Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

**Points Progression.** At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, Regulation K3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of Progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

### **STANDARD CLASSES**

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

#### **Grade 1 (Elementary)**

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.*

#### **Grade 2 (Starters)**

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 Starters are not eligible for this class*

#### **Grade 3 (Graduate)**

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

#### **Grade 4 (Novice)**

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

#### **Grade 5 (Intermediate)**

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7

#### **Grade 6 (Senior)**

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

#### **Grade 7 (Advanced)**

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

### **Rules and Regulations**

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry fees are £2.50 per class, geriatric agility entry fee £1.50 (free for over 80s). Camping fee £15.00 for weekend.
3. Internet entries will be accepted via [www.ishowservices.com](http://www.ishowservices.com)
4. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. Dogs under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible to compete at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
6. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be KC registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
7. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
8. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
9. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
10. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
11. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
12. All offers of sponsorship or donations shall bear the names of the sponsors.
13. **The Kennel Club Standard Marking Regulations Apply.**
14. Obstacles will be in accordance with Kennel Club specifications for the relevant heights except for Anysize Jumping, where the jumps will be set at micro and small height only and handlers may elect to run their dog at the height they choose on the day and except for Geriatric Agility where the handlers may elect to run their dog at the height they choose on the day.
15. Height Limit for Dogs
  - (a) Large Dogs For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers
  - (b) Medium Dogs For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers
  - (c) Small Dogs For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers
16. A Judge at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part- ownership, or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging.

17. **Withdrawal of dogs from Competition:**  
A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Show if it is:-
- A bitch which is in season.
  - Suffering from any infections or contagious disease.
  - Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
  - Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
  - Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
18. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition i.e. 5<sup>th</sup> May 2010 shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog will be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
19. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
20. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club/society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped, addressed envelope submitted within 1 month of the show date..
21. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring
22. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
23. **Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease** - No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
24. **Animals in Event** No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
25. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a KC Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a KC Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the competitor.
26. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
27. In case of cancellation of the show within 7 days of the show date, notification will be sent to the relevant web sites where possible and notified to the iSS Show Hotline 07532 11 11 57. It will be the competitor's responsibility to check with the Hotline and/or the Web sites, if continuation of the show is in doubt.
28. Competitors briefing will be held prior to the start of each class. They will be allowed to walk the course, but without the dog accompanying them.
29. No dog will be allowed in the ring at any time other than when being judged, no practising will be allowed in the ring.
30. All dogs are entered at this Show at their owner's risk and, whilst taking every care, the Committee cannot be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury howsoever caused to dogs, people or property whilst at this Show.
31. Any owner, exhibitor or handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove, as soon as possible, any fouling caused by their dog/s within the venue including the exercise area, car park and show approaches.
32. In all matters concerning the competition, the judge's decision is final. In all other matters the decision of the show organisers is final.
33. **Welfare of Dogs** A competitor whose dog is entered at a KC licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under KC Rules and Regulations.

## TO FIND US:

### Directions to Solihull Riding Club

From North & South on M42, leave at Junction 4, and from the roundabout take the A3400 towards Henley in Arden. In 150 yards continue straight on at traffic lights.

DO NOT TURN LEFT INTO GATE LANE AS THIS IS VERY NARROW & WINDING AND UNSUITABLE FOR LARGE VANS & CARAVANS.

In approximately ¾ mile turn left at the 1<sup>st</sup> roundabout into Box Trees Rd, and continue straight on into Four Ashes Road. Venue is on the left and will be signposted.



### ALL non-competing dogs brought on to the showground must be entered on your schedule N.F.C. (NOT FOR COMPETITION)

We shall have hot food all day long.

There will be plenty of rubbish and dog mess containers. **PLEASE CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG** or you will be asked to leave.

A water point is provided for fresh water supply only and **NOT** for rinsing chemical toilets. This will be rigorously enforced, for the health and safety of everyone, and any person found emptying their chemical toilet anywhere other than the chemical toilet emptying point will be asked to leave the venue immediately: their name will be circulated to other clubs and will also be published in the Agility magazines. Rubbish skips will also be on site.

**Parents are reminded that they are responsible for the behaviour and good conduct of their children. Unsupervised minors will not be allowed on the site.**

**Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.**
