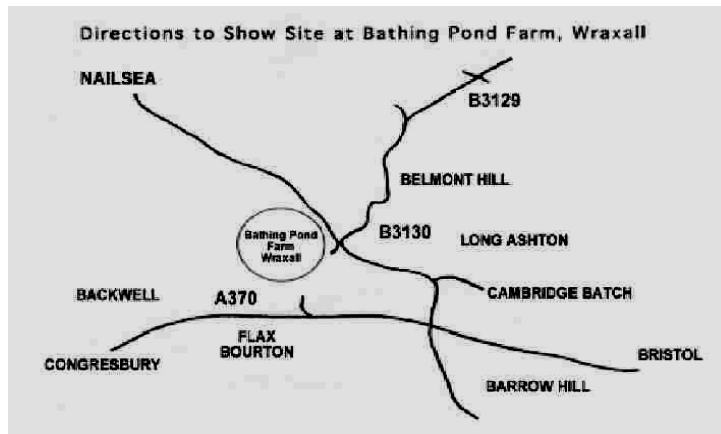

It is recommended that you avoid Bristol city centre and continue along M4 to M5. Follow instructions below for M5 Southbound

FROM M5 SOUTHBOUND

Leave M5 at Junction 19 (Gordano Services). At end of the slip road, take the second exit off the roundabout (A369 to Bristol). Follow the A369 for 3.4 miles to traffic lights. Turn right onto B3129 (Beggars Bush Lane). Follow the B3129 for 2 miles to traffic lights at cross roads. Follow B3129 (Weston Road) straight over the crossroads. Continue down the hill for 1.4 miles to cross roads. Turn right at cross roads

onto B3130 (Clevedon Road) toward Nailsea. Follow B3130 for 0.4 miles and entrance is on left hand side. Once in the vicinity of the showground, please follow the blue directional road signs

FROM M5 NORTHBOUND

Leave M5 at Junction 20 (Clevedon). At end of the slip road, take the first exit off the roundabout (Clevedon). At the next roundabout, take third exit (Northern Way) for ½ mile. At the mini roundabout, take second exit onto B3130 (Tickenham Road). Follow B3130 for 4.0 miles to traffic lights at T-junction (opposite Somerfield). Turn left and continue following the B3130 for 2.8 miles and entrance is on right hand side. Once in the vicinity of the showground, please follow the blue directional road signs

CLASSIFICATION

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade) In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary)	For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests. <i>N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.</i>
Grade 2 (Starters)	Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7, and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. <i>N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.</i>
Grade 3 (Graduate)	Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.
Grade 4 (Novice)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.
Grade 5 (Intermediate)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.
GRADE 6 (Senior)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.
GRADE 7 (Advanced)	Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Test. 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

PRIZES

Rosettes will be given to at least 10% of the entry in all classes. Trophies will be for 1st place in all classes and for all grades within graded classes. Additional trophies will be presented subject to the size of entry within each class.

Unplaced clear round rosettes in all classes collectable ON THE DAY only

SHOW REGULATIONS

- 1 Dogs entered at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
- 2 Entry fee £2.50
- 3 Internet entries will be accepted via ISS at www.ishowservices.com
- 4 The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 5 Dogs under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows.
- 6 Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
- 7 No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
- 8 No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
- 9 Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar ie. Not attached by a ring.
- 10 Should a Judge be unable to fulfil their appointment to judge, the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
- 11 No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
- 12 No classes are sponsored. There is no prize money in any class.
- 13 Kennel Club Standard marking Regulations will apply.
- 14 The jumps will be 65cm for large dog classes, 45cm for medium dog classes and 35cm for small dog classes
- 15 The Height limit for dogs.
 - a Large Dogs – For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
 - b Medium Dogs – For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers
 - c Small Dogs – For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers
- 16 Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging.
- 17 A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Test if it is
 - a A bitch which is in season.
 - b Suffering from any infectious/contagious disease
 - c Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any other person or animal.
 - e Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
- 18 In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition, i.e. 8th April 2010, shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. **In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show.** The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
- 19 Should circumstances so dictate, the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 20 In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club/society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped, addressed envelope submitted within 1 month of the show date.
- 21 Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to the dog in the ring.
- 22 Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
- 23 All competitors will be provided with a free pass enabling them to enter the event at any time of the day their competition is scheduled, but in the case of a dog owned in partnership only one such pass will be issued. Junior competitors will be provided with an extra entry ticket for a Guardian.
- 24 No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Show may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
- 25 No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
- 26 All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 27 A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
- 28 There is insufficient space at this show for a practice ring.
- 29 An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
- 30 All dogs are entered at their owner's risk, whilst every care will be taken, Severnside DAC will not accept responsibility for the loss, damage/injury to persons, dogs or property.
- 31 Competitors are asked to keep all children under control, especially near the rings.
- 32 Your attention is drawn to Kennel Club rule F8(A) regarding dog fouling. "Any owner, exhibitor or handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including the car and caravan parks and the show approaches".
- 33 Any bank charges resulting from cheques for entry fees being returned by the bank, will be the responsibility of the competitor concerned.

DOG SAFETY IN HOT CARS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

The Severnside May Bank Holiday Show 2010

This will be the fifth Severnside DAC show held as part of the North Somerset Agricultural Show at
BATHING POND FIELDS, WRAXALL, (ON THE B3130) NEAR BRISTOL

The one-day North Somerset Agricultural Show comprises classes for cattle, sheep, pigs, llamas and horses, and the Dog Agility Show will be held within the showground. There is plenty to see and do around the show, from the tractor pulling competitions to terrier racing and the Pony Club Games. From rural crafts to vintage tractors, live blacksmithing to shopping amongst the trade stands and food hall - there is something to suit everyone who enjoys the rural way of life.

The Agricultural Show does include some gun events and there are frequent loud bangs during the course of the day. Competitors should be aware of this when they enter the show.

EACH COMPETITOR WILL BE SENT, ALONG WITH THEIR RUNNING ORDERS, ONE NORTH SOMERSET SHOW ENTRY PASS FOR EACH SPECIFIED DOG HANDLER, ONLY SPECIFIED DOG HANDLERS WILL AUTOMATICALLY BE SENT A PASS INTO THE SHOWGROUND. IN THE CASE OF A JUNIOR HANDLER (under 18) ONE ADDITIONAL TICKET WILL BE SENT FOR AN ACCOMPANYING ADULT. A MAXIMUM OF ONE ENTRY PASS per DOG ENTERED WILL BE APPLIED WHEN ISSUING TICKETS.

Additional exhibitor tickets are available for friends and family at the reduced rate of Adult: £8.00 Child: £4.00, only when booked and paid for on this entry form This compares very favourably with advance tickets, which are £9.00 for an adult, £4.00 child, and Show day price of £12.00 for an adult, £6.00 for a child. Please indicate on the entry form, the number of extra exhibitor tickets required. If further tickets are required at a later date please call the Show box office on 01749-813899 to purchase tickets at the advance ticket price Also one car park pass to the Forward Car Park will be sent with each application. This is a public car park and Severnside D.A.C. cannot accept any responsibility for losses in the car park. If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused. Officials will be patrolling the car park during the show.
