## THE KENNEL CLUB OLYMPIA SPECIAL LARGE DOG ABC AGILITY STAKES 2011

This competition is a *special* agility competition open to all dogs excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and any of their crosses. In the event of a dispute over the parentage of a dog, a decision will be left to the judge's discretion.

Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for Large dogs are those measuring over 430 mm (1 foot 5 inches) at the withers and open to dogs in grades 1 to 7 and judged under the Kennel Club regulations for standard classes.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the semi-finals. Handlers may only qualify one dog for the final which will be the highest placed dog at the semi-final. Once a dog has qualified for the semifinal/final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the final/semi finals.

The first four previously unqualified placed dogs will be invited from each heat to compete in the semi-final. The first ten highest placed dogs at the semi-final will be invited to compete in the finals to be held at Olympia, London.

***The following regulations also apply to this competition:***

### OVERALL OLYMPIA AGILITY STAKES REGULATIONS 2011

All events must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club regulations H & H(1) in force at the time of the event. Competitors entering any competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these regulations.

All heats must take place at Kennel Club licensed shows and the class name in the schedule should replicate exactly the name of the competition as stated in these regulations.

All Kennel Club supported competitions should be judged using standard marking.

If the entry for the heat exceeds the Kennel Club limit for a judge in a day, then the class will be equally split and another judge appointed for the second part. Qualifiers and reserves from that heat will be taken in equal proportion from each part, giving the total number originally required from that heat (except where individual competition rules state differently). Rosettes and awards remain unchanged if the heat is split.

Dogs entered in any heats must be eligible for the competition entered and judges retain the right to check the height of any dog or ask to see the height stated in the Kennel Club Record Book.

Competitors can qualify for any Olympia final but it must be with different dogs. The first final a handler qualifies a dog for will be the final that particular dog competes in at Olympia.

*(These rules would be amended if any changes are made to Kennel Club agility regulations during the course of the year)*

### CELEBRATION ADVANCED POWER AND SPEED

This class is only open for dogs eligible for grade 7 competitions.

Handlers may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the final. Once a dog has qualified for the final further heats may be entered for competition.

The first 4 places from each heat will be invited to compete in the final.

It is most important that handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the show secretary on the day of the show of this fact.

The first section of the course will contain all the contact equipment plus the weaving poles, two rising spread jumps at maximum width and height, and the long jump at maximum length.

**This first section must be timed. It is recommended that a generous maximum time be applied.**

The second section of the course will consist only of single pole hurdles, and will be against the clock. The object of the class is for the dog to negotiate the first part of the course clear, before proceeding across the start line to commence the second section of the course, which should be set as a fast speed jumping course.

#### NOTE

Only dogs that are clear on the first section can attempt the second section. Normal judging rules apply except that on the first section, handlers may line up their dogs before taking any obstacle without penalty. The winner will be decided in the usual way of the fastest time with the least faults.

It is advisable for judges to note that the original intention was for the jumping part of the course to be fast and free flowing to produce an exciting finish.



### CELEBRATION CONNECTION RULES

#### Objective

Gain as many points as possible ( max 32 ) in the given course time ( set by judge ).

Then stop the timing in the quickest time

#### How

Complete 3 different jump's successfully then a bonus obstacles. Until all 4 bonus's have been attempted or you run out of time.

#### Rules for obstacle placement

1. Tyre and Dog Walk **must not** be used
2. Connecting Jumps: min 6, max 9 (excluding judges bonus )
3. Connecting jumps must be place within the 4 bonus obstacles
4. Connecting jumps must not be a spread jump
5. Only one bonus obstacle may be placed on each side of the ring
6. Bonus obstacle ( 1 ) weaves
7. Bonus obstacle ( 2 ) jump + see saw ( jump must be aligned straight on to see saw )
8. Bonus obstacle ( 3 ) the A frame
9. Bonus obstacle ( 4 ) is a combination invented by the judge containing 1, 2, or 3 obstacles. The judge may stipulate in which order obstacles are taken. Spreads may be used but only jumped in the correct direction
10. Start and finish obstacles are for timing only and will not count. ( they may or may not be the same obstacle. Jump, tunnel or table)
11. The start and finish can be inside the bonus obstacles, timing permitting
12. In the event of the whistle sounding when a dogs in committed to an obstacle or within a bonus section the points will be award upon successful completion.
13. Judges will need a scribe and a timer as per the old Gamblers and 2 whistles

#### Points

Jumps 1 point

Bonus 5 points each

#### Course time

Set by judge

## Rule for competitors

1. The Dog must start the timing.
2. In the event of the dog running past the start obstacle you must put your dog directly back over the start obstacle without touch or re setting up ( this may be done in either direction).
3. The start obstacle does not count, it is there for timing purposes only .This obstacle will not be faulted. (If it is a jump it cannot be part of any connecting 3 )
4. Refusals will not be marked
5. Missed Weaves pole entry or faults during the weaves count as a bonus failure (see rule 13)
6. Missed contact will counts as a bonus failure
7. Faults in the judge's bonus will also count as a bonus failure.
8. 3 different jumps must be completed correctly before attempting a bonus
9. After attempting a bonus the same jumps may be used again
10. Bonus's may be taken in any order provided they are proceeded by 3 correctly completed jumps
11. Jumps may be taken from either side
12. Jump numbers are for identification only
13. Each bonus may only be attempted once ( a failed bonus counts as an attempt). **If in the opinion of the judge your dog attempts a bonus or part of a bonus and that bonus is not completed successfully this will result in a failed bonus.**
14. The dog must stop the timing after either successfully completing the 4 bonus's or when the time limit is reached, indicated by a whistle blowing ( whichever comes first )
15. The dog must also stop the timing when a round is ended due to elimination ( indicated by a whistle blowing)
16. The round will end when the timing is stopped
17. Fallen jumps will not be replaced

## Elimination

When eliminated dogs must leave the ring via the finish obstacle as quickly as possible to gain a time.

Failure to do so will result in no score being recorded.

Obstacles taken on the way to the finish will not be faulted.

All points gained up to the elimination will stand.

## Eliminations will result in the following cases

1. The Dog touching a bonus obstacle before completing 3 jumps correctly
2. Jumping 4 jumps in succession
4. The Dog touching the same bonus twice
5. Only 2 jumps left standing
6. Jumping a spread obstacle the wrong way
7. The Dog touching a bonus obstacle or jump or jumping an obstacle before starting the time
8. Jumping the same jump twice in a connection of 3 without doing a bonus

**Note: taking the judges bonus obstacles in the wrong order or direction will not result in elimination, but no bonus points will be awarded. ( spread jump excepted ).**

## FAQ for Celebration Connection

1. Why is there no Tyre or Dogwalk Allowed  
**Due to the size of the dogwalk it was thought that it may encourage dogs to get on at awkward angles causing unsteady and possible dangerous footing. Tyre angles are always a problem and as with the dogwalk we do not want to encourage attempting obstacles from dangerous positions.**
2. If my dog runs through the wings of a jump that's down will I be faulted.  
**No it may be that the only safe route to a bonus is through a fallen jump**
3. If my dog breaks the wait but doesn't cross the start line can I go back and re-set up.  
**Probably but ultimately this will be at the Judges discretion**
4. Why can't I go back and re-set my dog up if it goes past the first jump.  
**Technically once the dog has gone passed the start line you are deemed to be on the course and the round has started, touching the dog would be seen as training in the ring and you would be eliminated.**
5. What happens if I touch the dog while in the ring.  
**Deliberate handling will result in elimination.**
6. What happens if my dog attempts a 4th jump but knocks it down and then goes on to a bonus obstacle.  
**You would be eliminated for doing the wrong Course**

7. What would happen if the handler knocks a jump down  
**Nothing, unless there were only 2 left standing or you were unable to complete a 3<sup>rd</sup> jump. This would result in elimination**
8. What if my dog goes under a jump.  
**Nothing the jump is not counted**
9. What if my dog takes an obstacle or jump on the way to the finish, after the whistle has blow.  
**Nothing unless the judge deems that you are training and you will be asked to leave the ring with a void score**
10. What if my dogs knocks the start obstacle over.  
**Nothing so long as the timing starts if not it is at judge's discretion**
11. Can my dog jump the same jump more than once in a round  
**Yes so long as you attempt a bonus in-between**
12. Can my dog jump in the jump that's part of the see saw bonus in any direction **Yes**
13. What if my dog doesn't complete the weaves correctly? **Failed bonus**

#### ELIGIBILITY AND DEFINITION OF CLASSES

**Class Structure.** A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

**Progression.** Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

**Points Progression.** At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, Regulation K3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of Agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs. This classification applies to competitions for large, medium and small dogs.

**Grade 1** - For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at a Kennel Club licensed Agility Show. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.*

**Grade 2 - (Starters)** Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades **1,3,4,5,6,7**, and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at a Kennel Club licensed Agility Show or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *N.B Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.*

**Grade 3** – Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows & dogs which are not eligible for Grades 4, 5, 6 or 7

**Grade 4** – Open to dogs which have gained a 1<sup>st</sup> place in an Agility class or 3 first places in jumping classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at a Kennel Club licensed Agility shows and are not eligible for grades 3, 5, 6, or 7

**Grade 5** – Open to dogs which have gained a 1<sup>st</sup> place in an Agility class or 3 first places in jumping classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows and are not eligible for grades 3, 4, 6 or 7

**Grade 6** – Open to dogs which have gained a 1<sup>st</sup> place in an Agility Class or 3 first places in jumping classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for grade 3, 4, 5 or 7

**Grade 7** – Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 1<sup>st</sup> places at grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows, 2 first places must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes.

**Any Size** – Open to all dogs not entered in any other class at the show (except other anysize class). It is particularly suitable for inexperienced dogs or handlers and those dogs that are unable to compete at their full height.

The class will have no weaves, tyre or contact equipment.

Jump height for large dogs will be 35cm and for medium/small dogs will be micro height. The course will be very simple and flowing.

### **Camping is limited**

- Available for a fixed fee of £15.00 for Friday & Saturday nights only
- Arrivals welcome from 3pm.
- Please ensure you indicate on entry form if you would like your entry returned if camping is full.
- Please indicate on entry form if you would like to camp in a group and ensure you all put down the same name, we are not responsible if you don't!
- Each unit must be equipped with its own means of fire extinguisher or bucket of water at the tow hitch.
- NO BARBEQUES or OPEN FIRES.
- No training equipment allowed in the camping areas.

# SHOW REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/ Authority to compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry fees: £2.60 per class.
3. No prize money will be given.
4. Internet entries will be accepted via ISS at [www.ishowservices.com](http://www.ishowservices.com)
5. The committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
6. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests.
7. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under a test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another Judge.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
13. Sponsors – Kennel Club, Dial- a- Dog-Wash, GT Nutrition, Easter Celebration.
14. Kennel Club standard marking will apply in all scheduled classes.
15. The height of the hurdles for the Any-size Jumping will be 35cm for large dogs and micro height for small/medium dogs.
16. Height limit for dogs, Large – dogs measuring over 43cm at the withers, Medium – dogs measuring over 35cm and under 43cm at the withers, Small – measuring under 35cm at the withers.
17. Judges at an Agility Test may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the test at which they are judging.
18. Withdrawal of dogs from Test  
A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Test if it is –
  - a. A bitch which is in season
  - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease
  - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of another opponent
  - d. Of such a temperament of is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal
  - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing
19. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition (07/09/10) shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class (es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered in the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
20. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
21. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances the club/society will refund fees, less reasonable incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped, addressed envelope submitted within one month of the show date.
22. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
23. Separate entry forms must be completed by each competitor and must be signed by the competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
24. Competition of dogs suffering from contagious or infectious diseases – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease, or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A/42
25. Animals in event  
No animal other than the one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
26. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
27. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
28. A practice ring will be available if space allows. This ring must be supervised by an adult with agility knowledge.
29. Parents will be held responsible for the actions of their children. Please ensure your children do not cause any damage, or interfere with the equipment or the property of the society or others.
30. Welfare of dogs An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club Licensed event should take all responsible steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise.
