The Summer Open Agility Show – 27th, 28th, 29th, 30th August 2010 SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at KC Licensed agility tests must be registered at the Kennel Club (KC) in accordance with KC Regulations for classification for Regulation B. The registration number/authority to compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry fees £2.65 per dog, per class. £5.30 per pair per class. Camping £8.50 per unit per night
3. There will be no prize money.
4. Internet entries will be accepted via www.iShowServices.com
5. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
6. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed Agility shows.
7. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged 4 calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at ANY time within the precincts of the Kennel Club licensed show.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting leather or webbing collar is permitted providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar, i.e. not attached by a ring.
11. Should a Judge be unable to fulfill the appointment the Committee reserves the right to appoint another Judge(s).
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
13. Sponsorship: The embroidery Shop, Karen Parker.
14. Kennel Club Standard marking Regulations apply in all standard classes.
15. Classes 10, 37 and 64 jump height will be 350mm.
16. The Height limit for dogs:
 - a. Large Dogs: For dogs measuring over 430 mm (1ft 5 inches) at the withers.
 - b. Medium dogs: measuring over 350 mm (1ft 1.75 inches) and measuring 430 mm (1ft 5 inches) or under at the withers. (If applicable)
 - c. Small dogs: For dogs measuring 350 mm (1ft 1.75 inches) or under at the withers. (If applicable)
17. A Judge, at an Agility Show, cannot compete or enter a dog for competition on the day he/she is judging, which is recorded as owned or part ownership (there will be a separate license for each day).
18. Withdrawal of dogs from the test – a dog must be withdrawn if:
 - (a) A bitch is in season;
 - (b) Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
 - (c) Interfering with the safety or chances of winning of another competitor.
 - (d) Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - (e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
19. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition, i.e. 2nd August, shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class (es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
20. Should circumstances dictate the Show Committee, in consultation with the Judge(s), may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
21. **Animals in event:** No animal, other than the one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the Show Society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
22. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries, without a Kennel Club Registration number or an authority to compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
23. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that their dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
24. Competition of dogs suffering from contagious or infectious disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
25. A Pay on the Day class will be held if time permits. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring will be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
26. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
27. Training in the ring during competitions is not allowed
28. **Separate entry forms MUST BE completed by owner or Authorised Agent each competitor and MUST BE signed by the owner or Authorised Agent or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon.** Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
29. Entries will only be accepted on official entry forms. (Photocopies accepted.)
30. Should the Judge decide it is required, a standard may be imposed.
31. It is the Competitor's responsibility to ensure that the correct score is recorded on the Score Sheet. Mistakes cannot be rectified after the class has closed.
32. Parents are responsible for the behaviour/safety of their children under 18 years of age.
33. **Camping:** Only one space can be saved unless by prior agreement with the show organisers. **Campers must keep to their allocated space and MUST NOT obstruct the roadways in any way.**
34. In the event that the Show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club/society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped addressed envelope submitted within 1 month of the Show date.
35. Dogs are entered at their owner's risk and whilst every care will be taken the Committee, officials or sponsors will accept no responsibility for loss, damage or injury however caused to dogs, persons or property whilst at the Show.
36. The person (s) in control of their dog(s) **are responsible** for clearing up after their dog(s) have fouled. **ONLY 2 DOGS TO BE EXERCISED OFF LEAD AT ANY ONE TIME.**
37. Adults with accompanying children are expected to be responsible for their children's behavior and actions whilst at the show.
38. To enable the show to run as smoothly as possible and to be fare to all who attend, each competitor will be required to give some time in ring party duties during the show. Pack lunches will be provided for half day or more helpers and 'T' shirts for all day helpers
39. **The speed limit within the precincts of the show is walking pace, deliberate failure to observe this rule could lead to the driver being banned from the show without refund.**
40. **Welfare of Dogs**
Any exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare

Warning: If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

The Summer Open Agility Show – 27th, 28th, 29th, 30th August 2010

ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

This classification should apply to competitions for large, medium and small dogs. In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open Agility Shows (i.e. Limited Agility Shows, special classes and invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round will count towards grade progression. Societies may schedule classes other than those defined below. The eligibility for "Special" classes must be defined by the Society and included in the schedule. The word "Special" must be included in the title of the class. Agility classes to include contact points and Jumping classes where there are not contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a F Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, Regulation K3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the **definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.**

Grade 1 (Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 2 (Starters)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 3 (Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) classes.

Eligibility and Definition of classes

Large

For those dogs measuring over 430 mm at the withers.

Medium

For those dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and 430mm(1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.

Small Open to those dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.

In accordance with Kennel Club rules, large dogs who have not competed before 1st January 2007 and ALL Small & Medium dogs must have been officially measured before competing at a Kennel Club licensed agility show.

SPECIAL CLASS DEFINITIONS

Power & Speed

The primary pieces of equipment to be negotiated, untimed, and followed by a jumping course, which will be timed. There will be one set of awards for this class

Tunnel Terrors

A jumping course which will feature the multiple use of tunnels

Pairs Helter Skelter

A standard Helter Skelter course to be completed by two dogs and two handlers

ABC

Open to large dogs, which are not registered at the Kennel Club as Border Collie or Working Sheepdog or first bc/ws crosses.

Take your own line (TYOL)

An agility course in which all the pieces of equipment should be negotiated once only by the dog. A start and finish line will be defined by the judge. Suitable equipment may be taken from either direction.

Old Timers Open to *large* dogs aged 8 years or more and who have **not competed** at full height at a licensed agility show over the **previous 4 months prior to 27th August 2010**. The height of the jumps will be 350 mm.

They may not enter any other classes except other Old Timers classes.

Steeple chase: A jumping course without weave poles.



DFS CRUFTS SMALL DOG AGILITY CHALLENGE 2010-2011

This is a competition consisting of eight heats of agility. It is open to small dogs, who measure 35cm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers and will be a combined class of grades 1 to 7.

Competitors will score 20 points for 1st place down to 1 point for 20th place. Points will be accumulated over all eight heats and the 20 dogs with the most points will qualify for the final at DFS Crufts 2011.

In the event of a tie, leading to more than 20 dogs being in qualifying positions, the dog/s considered most consistent overall will then qualify.

Competitors may enter as many dogs as they like in the heats but can only qualify a maximum of two dogs for the final.

The final consists of two rounds of agility competitions known as Part 1 and Part 2. The winner of the Challenge will be the dog and handler with the least combined faults in the fastest combined time calculated over the two rounds of the final.

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these. Standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size set at the maximum height/length stated for small dogs.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, reserves will be taken from dog/s with the highest number of points from the heats who has not qualified.



DFS CRUFTS SMALL / MIXI PAIRS CHALLENGE 2010-2011 (Special)

This is a competition consisting of eight heats of jumping. It is a relay competition with a baton change taking place either in a box or behind a line at the judges' discretion. The competition is open to small dogs, partnering either a medium dog or a large dog and will be a combined class of grades 1 to 7.

Points will be awarded to the pair, which consists of the same two handler and dog combinations. Points are not transferable between different pair combinations.

Pairs will score 15 points for 1st place down to 1 point for 15th place. Points will be accumulated over all eight heats and the 15 pairs with the most points will go through to the final at DFS Crufts 2011

Handlers with more than one dog may enter in more than one pair. However, they may only qualify a maximum of two dogs for the final. The pairs with the most points attained first will qualify for the final. No surrogate handlers will be allowed in the final.

The winner of the Small / Mixi Pairs Challenge will be the pair with the fastest time with the least faults.

The competition is open to two dogs with separate handlers. One dog must be a small dog, 35cm or under at the withers, the partner can be either a medium dog, over 35cm but 43cm or under at the withers, or a large dog, over 43cm in height.

Should a qualified dog or handler within a pair be unable/unfit to enter the final, reserves will be taken from the pair with the highest points who have not qualified.

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to abide by these rules and regulations. Standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size set at the maximum height for each category.

The competition will involve a change of height of the obstacles being jumped by the medium/large dogs at one stage during the class. The judge will decide which height of dog to start with and will announce the change of height when relevant. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available accordingly. The course will be walked by everyone before the beginning of the class.



DFS CRUFTS SMALL DOG CIRCULAR KNOCK-OUT 2010-2011 (Special)

There will be eight heats of the Small Dog Circular Knock-out and the first two places in each will qualify for the final at DFS Crufts 2011. The competition is open to small dogs, measuring 35cm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers and will be a combined class of grades 1 to 7, a draw will be made for each heat.

Competitors may enter more than one dog for each heat but may only qualify one dog for the final. Their first dog to qualify will be invited to the final. Once qualified a handler may not enter any further heats.

The competitor to go through to the next round will be the first to finish with the least number of faults.

This is a circular knock-out and in the interest of safety there will be no collapsible tunnel, dog walk or see-saw. The course will contain weaving poles.

Dogs will start and finish from a line in the middle of the circle. Equipment may be used on this line although in the interest of safety it must be off-set so that the dogs are not running at each other when finishing.

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entered will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations. Standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size set at the maximum size stated for small dogs.

It is the competitors' responsibility to book in at the show if necessary and also to be at the ring when needed.

Should a faster dog catch up with the other dog, the slower dog **MUST** stand clear to allow the faster dog to pass it by.

It is the handlers responsibility to ensure that any dogs that are likely to be aggressive on a circular course where they are competing with another dog and may pass or be passed by another dog should **NOT** be entered. Any dog displaying any kind of aggressive behaviour on the course **WILL BE ELIMINATED IMMEDIATELY.**

False start ruling will be made at the judges' discretion.
