Eligibility for Classes

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw.

With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins in standard classes at that grade, except that progression from Grade 5 will require 3 wins at Grade 5, one of which must be an agility class. Progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers), except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary) - For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 2 (Starters) - Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 3 (Graduate) Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice) - Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior) - Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 3 first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an Agility (not Jumping) Class, and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced) Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

Special Classes

Societies may schedule classes other than those defined above as "Special classes". The eligibility for "Special" classes must be defined by the Society and included in the schedule. The word "Special" must be included in the title of the class. Where special classes are classified for older and/or inexperienced dogs, the height of the hurdles and the A-ramp, and the length of the long jump, may be reduced below the dimensions specified in these regulations, in which case such dimensions must be included in the class definition in the show schedule.

Marking for special classes may deviate from marking for standard classes, but must be specified in the schedule. Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.

Anysize Jumping (Special Class) – Open to all sizes of dog aged 18 months or over, and not entered in any other **grade progression** class at the show. There will be no weaves, tyre, long jump or contact equipment. The jump heights will be 35cm & 25cm. A dog may enter either jump height regardless of its size, and the handler may choose on the day which height they wish to run at. Clear round rosettes will be available to all dogs entered in this class who achieve a clear round within the course time.



THE FITZPATRICK REFERRALS 4TH HEIGHT JUMPING CUP (Special)



In support of the introduction of a “4th” height at 550mm in KC Agility tests, television’s “Bionic Vet” Noel Fitzpatrick is continuing his involvement with The Fitzpatrick Referrals 4th Height Jumping Cup for the 2016 Grand Final, in association with Agility Edge.

This event is open to all dogs measuring over 430mm at the withers (ie over Medium height) and with jump heights set at 550mm. Entering a heat cannot prevent you from entering ALL the other classes your dog is eligible for at a show, including Large, Anysize or the equivalent (check the schedule for restrictions as usual).

The top 4 dogs and handlers in each of the 10 heats will qualify for the Grand Final, being held in the main arena at Fitzpatrick Referrals’ own dog-centric public event, DogFest.

Rules

- Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat and qualify more than one dog for the final.
- Qualifiers may enter further heats for competition, providing they are eligible.
- Handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the Show Secretary on the day of the show. In the event of a dog qualifying more than once for the Final, or a handler being unable to attend the final, reserves may be invited.
- The Fitzpatrick Referrals 4th Height Jumping Cup heats and final will consist of hurdles set at 550mm, weaves and tunnels only.
- The Fitzpatrick Referrals 4th Height Jumping Cup is open to all grades of dog measuring over 430mm at the withers.
- Competitors entering the competition are deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules and regulations of the host club.
- Rosettes to 10 percent in each heat, up to 15th place.
- Trophies 1st to 3rd place in each heat
- Should a heat need to be split, the prize allocation will be decided by the host club and event organisers
- The Fitzpatrick Referrals 4th Height Jumping Cup for the 2016 final will consist of 10 heats held at agility shows around the country
- **Grand Final.** The top 4 dogs and handlers from each heat will be invited to compete at Fitzpatrick Referrals’ prestigious public show, DogFest 2016

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. There will not be any prize money in any class.
4. Online entries can only be made via ISS - www.ishowservices.com
5. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
6. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.

7. Classes will not be capped.
8. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
9. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
10. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
11. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
12. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
13. **No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges. Anyone found to be rude to judges will be asked to leave the show.**
14. Kennel Club Standard marking Regulations apply for all standard classes.
15. The heights of the jump obstacles will be as per rule H(1)(B)3a, ie. 650mm for large dogs; 450mm for medium dogs; 350mm for small dogs. Any size jump heights will be 35cms & 25cms. Class 32 the jumps will be set at 550cms.
16. All equipment will comply with regulation H(1)(B)2.
17. The height limit for dogs:
 - a) Large Dogs – for dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
 - b) Medium Dogs – for dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
 - c) Small Dogs – for dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
18. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
19. Removal of dogs from Competition. Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be
 20. prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:
 - a) A bitch, which is in season.
 - b) Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d) Of such temperament or so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
 The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition/show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club.
21. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the date of the show i.e. up to and including 23rd June 2015, shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, **it is the competitor's responsibility to notify iSS at least 14 days before the date of the show**. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade
22. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
23. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
24. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring.
25. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
26. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
27. No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
28. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
29. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
30. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
31. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
32. Running orders & ring plan for those entering on iSS will only be available for download from the site and will not be posted
33. **Welfare of Dogs** . An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations
34. **Dogs in Cars:** Your dog is vulnerable and **AT RISK** during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.

The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink. Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.

When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

DOGS MUST BE KEPT UNDER CONTROL AT ALL TIMES

DIRECTIONS TO VENUE: Postcode BA1 9BU

From the M4, Junction 18

Turn south onto the A46 towards Bath. Go through Pennsylvania and at the roundabout take the third exit towards Bristol on A420. Take first major left turn at top of hill signposted to Hamswell. After about a mile, turn left at road junction. Lansdown racecourse is a couple of miles further on the right hand side. This is the best route for caravans as it avoids the major hills.

From the South from Bath follow signs for Lansdown and Wick. The Racecourse is about 3 miles from Bath centre on Lansdown Road). The racecourse is on the left side past the Blaithwaite Arms.

From the East Travelling along the A420 from Chippenham, at the A46 roundabout take the second exit staying on the A420 Take first major left turn at top of hill signposted to Hamswell. After about a mile, turn left at road junction. Lansdown racecourse is a couple of miles further on the right hand side.

Drive carefully across the golf course in front of the main grandstand and over the racetrack to the centre of the racetrack.

Bath Racecourse is well sign-posted from all major routes to its location on Lansdown Hill.

PLEASE COULD YOU HELP AT THE SHOW?

All help will be very much appreciated.

Ring managers will get free camping and lunch.

Helpers will get free lunch and tickets for a helpers tombola.

Club's that can provide a full ring party will get £100 plus lunch and camping close to the rings.

Camping

Camping is restricted to a maximum of 150 units.

Camping fees must be paid with entries and camping passes must be displayed at all times.

Please indicate with your entry if you wish your entry to be returned if camping is not available or if you want to be placed on a waiting list for cancellations.

Camping will be available from 1pm Friday until the show closes on Sunday.

The racecourse authorities will not permit camping on the Sunday night.

People helping to set up the show are permitted from 9am Friday.

No generators are allowed after 9.00 pm.

Water pressure in this area is low so it is recommended you bring sufficient water for Friday evening.

Filling of water containers is limited to one container per unit at a time.

Refreshments will be available during the day, but not in the evenings and licensed bar facilities will not be available. There is a pub, the Blaithwaite Arms, an easy walk from the camping area.

Fire regulations

The racecourse authorities will not allow any barbeques or other fires in the racecourse area.

All camping units must provide their own fire fighting equipment ie extinguishers and water buckets.

Additional extinguishers will be available at the fire points next to the portable loos and in the secretaries office.

In the event of a fire make a brief attempt to put it out. If it cannot be brought under control quickly evacuate the area, call the fire brigade on 999 and assemble on the racecourse.

Let the show secretary know that all members of your party are safe.
