ELIGIBILITY AND DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins in standard classes at that grade, except that progression from Grade 5 will require 3 wins at Grade 5, one of which must be an agility class. Progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers), except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary) For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2 (Starters) Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 3 (Graduate) Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice) Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate) Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior) Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 3 first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an Agility (not Jumping) Class, and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced) Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

SPECIAL CLASSES Societies may schedule classes other than those defined above as "Special classes".

The eligibility for "Special" classes must be defined by the Society and included in the schedule. The word "Special" must be included in the title of the class. Where special classes are classified for older and/or inexperienced dogs, the height of the hurdles and the A-ramp, and the length of the long jump, may be reduced below the dimensions specified in these regulations, in which case such dimensions must be included in the class definition in the show schedule. Marking for special classes may deviate from marking for standard classes, but must be specified in the schedule. Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.

ABC – Open only to Large dogs that are NOT Collies or Collie Crosses

NBC – Open only to Large Dogs that ARE Collies or Collie crosses.

Steeplechase- A course of jumps and tunnels – no weaves.

Helter Skelter; This is a course with only jumps and tunnels (and maybe weaves).

Small: For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers .

Courses will comply with KC Spec. (all jumps 35cm).

Medium: Only dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers . Courses will comply with KC Spec. (all jumps 45cm).

Large: Only dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers (all jumps 65cm).

Any size: This class is intended for all sizes of dogs that are not entered in any other class on Saturday or Sunday and is intended for new dogs or those who cannot compete at normal height. Obstacle specifications are the same as for small classes with the following exceptions: There will be no tyre, there will be a maximum of six weaves (if used) A Frame will be a lowered height. Jumps will be 35cms, 25cms, 15cms. Graded Classes (i.e. 1,2 & 3) will run over same course.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1 Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
 2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
 - 3 Entry fees: £2.90 per dog/ class, SFR helping members £2.30. Camping units £22/unit.
 - 4 Prize money– not applicable
 - 5 The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
 - 6 Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows
 - 7 NFC Dogs aged four calendar months or over will be accepted . Dogs must be Kennel Club Registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
 - 8 No bitch in season will be allowed to compete.
 - 9 No person shall carry punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
 - 10 Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar ie not attached by a ring.
 - 11 Should a Judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge, the committee reserves the right to appoint another Judge.
 - 12 No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
 - 13 For all sponsors or donations please see schedule of classes.
 - 14 Standard marking as set out in Kennel Club Regulations H (1)(A) will apply to all standard classes.
 - 15 Height limit for dogs please see eligibility and definition of classes
 - 16 Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
 - 17 Removal of dogs from Competition: Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:-
 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
- The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition/show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club.
- 18 All wins up to and including 25 days (1st September 2015) before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitors responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant fees.
 - 19 Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judge(s), may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to The Kennel Club.
 - 20 No animal other than the one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the general committee. However, at the discretion of the show secretary a dog brought to a show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and will be kept under control at all times.
 - 21 A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
 - 22 A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
 - 23 No dog will be allowed in any competition ring at any time other than when being judged. No practising will be allowed in the rings (other than a ring specifically designated as a practice ring and only for the period of time that the ring is so designated).
 - 24 Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand or while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring.
 - 25 Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees. (ie Owner, not competitor)
 - 26 All competitors shall be allowed to walk the course before the start of the Test without their dogs.
 - 27 It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
 - 28 All dogs are entered at this Show at the owners risk and whilst the Committee will take every reasonable care, it shall not be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury, howsoever caused to dogs, people or property at the Show.
 - 29 In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
 - 30 Parents will be held responsible for the actions of their children. Please ensure your children do not cause any damage or interfere with equipment or the property of the Society or others.
 - 31 Small and medium dogs must have been measured and have their record books available if required.
 - 32 Large dogs that hadn't competed before 01/01/06 must have been measured & have their record books available if required.
 - 33 Organisers reserve the right to eject any person(s) from the show/showground for actions deemed detrimental to the show.
 - 34 Internet entries will be accepted via www.ishowservices.com
 - 35 Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - 36 Should a judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.

* Welfare of dogs: An exhibitor or competitor whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club Licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of the dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

THE FITZPATRICK REFERRALS 4TH HEIGHT JUMPING CUP

In support of the introduction of a "4th" height at 550mm in KC Agility tests, television's "Bionic Vet" Noel Fitzpatrick is continuing his involvement with The Fitzpatrick Referrals 4th Height Jumping Cup for the 2016 Grand Final, in association with Agility Edge.

This event is open to all dogs measuring over 430mm at the withers (ie over Medium height) and with jump heights set at 550mm. Entering a heat cannot prevent you from entering ALL the other classes your dog is eligible for at a show, including Large, Anysize or the equivalent (check the schedule for restrictions as usual).

The top 4 dogs and handlers in each of the 10 heats will qualify for the Grand Final, being held in the main arena at Fitzpatrick Referrals' own dog-centric public event, DogFest.

Rules

- Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat and qualify more than one dog for the final.
- Qualifiers may enter further heats for competition, providing they are eligible.
- Handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the Show Secretary on the day of the show. In the event of a dog qualifying more than once for the Final, or a handler being unable to attend the final, reserves may be invited.
- The Fitzpatrick Referrals 4th Height Jumping Cup heats and final will consist of hurdles set at 550mm, weaves and tunnels only.
